

The senior won the pentathlon, sweeping all five events, at the Jack Jennett Invitational with a school-record 4,406 points, including a school-record mark in the long jump (20-9).

Tereshinski, who retired from coaching after the 1999 season, was inducted into the MMČ Athletic Hall of Fame in 2007.

Anderson was a local pitcher who went on to sign with the New York Yankees in the late 1940s. The 1960 Yankton team advanced to the Teener World Series, beating a Williston, N.D., team led by former NBA playing and coaching great Phil Jackson, in the district final. Six of the 15 members of that team still live in Yankton.
