Lost in the shuffle of last Saturday's men's basketball showdown between South Dakota State and the University of South Dakota was the coaches. Specifically, Dave Boots not being on the bench for the Coyotes. It was a question SDSU coach Scott Nagy was asked after his Jackrabbits edged USD 70-68, and though he said he hadn't thought about it much, it was clear the rivalry was missing a key component. "Before these games we're both sick to our stomachs, but I'm sure he was nice and relaxed today watching the game," Nagy joked of Boots. "When I went down and shook Joey's (James) hand, we were just talking, and I said, 'It's a lot lonelier being a head coach, isn't it?'" Among all the names that changed for either program over the years, the one constant had been Boots and Nagy. Before retiring last fall, Boots had amassed a 21-17 record against the Jackrabbits,

but Nagy (who took over in 1995) won 14 of the 23 meetings against Boots' Coyotes. And now the man leading USD is James, who was tasked with guiding the program under an interim tag. After Saturday's loss to SDSU, James was asked about living with such an uncertainty about his future. "I don't sleep much, I'll be honest with you," he said. James again talked about his team's youth this season — 8 players are either freshmen or sophomores. "I have a lot of trust and faith in president (Jim) Abbott and (athletic director) David Herbst. They'll do what they think is best for this basketball program, moving forward." Nagy, for his part, didn't speak directly to that situation, but did express his observation that the Coyotes are improving with a new defense — from the Boots matchup zone to more of a true man to man. "What I think is amazing, those kids have primarily played zone their whole career, and he's teaching them to play zone," Nagy said. "And statistically they're better than us." "I think he's done a great job, particularly with his defense."

## BV Libero Signs With MMC Volleyball

Brandon's Taylor Murtha will attend Mount Marty College and play volleyball for the Lancers beginning in the 2014-15 season, MMC announced on Tuesday. Murtha, a 5-4 libero, earned all-Metro and all-Eastern South Dakota Conference honors for Brandon Valley High School, recording 529 digs on the season. Also an academic all-state honoree, she holds Lynx records for digs and serves received. "Taylor will be a great addition to our Mount Marty Campus," MMC head volleyball coach Candice Climer said of Murtha. "Taylor's athletic ability, knowledge of the game, and academics in the classroom will be a great asset to our program." Murtha, the daughter of Larry and Bonnie Murtha, plans to major in nursing at MMC. She will receive an academic merit scholarship in addition to her volleyball award.

## USD's Lewin Named SL Athlete Of The Week

ELMHURST, Ill. — Sophomore hurdler and jumper Teivaskie Lewin was named the Summit League's Men's Indoor Track and Field Athlete of

the Week for the second straight week after setting the league's best 60-meter hurdles time of the season last weekend. It's the second time he has won the honor. Lewin, a native of Montego Bay, Jamaica, won the event in 7.95 seconds at the Bill Bergan Invitational in Ames, Iowa, on Saturday. The time bested his previous league-best mark of 7.97 and ranks 39th in the nation. He also added an eighth-place finish in the long jump with a mark of 22 feet, 10 1/2 inches. Omaha's Sami Spenner earned women's honors for a league-record eighth time in her career, including the second this season. She posted the third-best pentathlon score in the world this year, and the top score in the U.S. according to the International Association of Athletics Federations' rankings. The senior won the pentathlon, sweeping all five events, at the Jack Jennett Invitational with a school-record 4,406 points, including a school-record mark in the long jump (20-9). USD will compete at the Frank Sevigne Husker Invite and will host the Dakota Realty Alumni Meet in the DakotaDome this weekend.

## Yankton Baseball Hall Of Fame Banquet Friday

The Yankton Baseball Association will hold its third annual Hall of Fame banquet and fundraiser on Friday, Feb. 7, in the banquet room at Minerva's. Inductees include Bob Tereshinski, Hal Anderson and the 1960 Yankton All-Star team, the first team to attend the national Teener baseball tournament in Hershey, Pa. Tereshinski coached the Yankton Legion team in the early 1980s, then took over the Mount Marty College program and turned the team into the premier college baseball program in South Dakota in the 1990s. Tereshinski, who retired from coaching after the 1999 season, was inducted into the MMC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2007. Anderson was a local pitcher who went on to sign with the New York Yankees in the late 1940s. The 1960 Yankton team advanced to the Teener World Series, playing a Williston, N.D., team led by former NBA player and coaching great Phil Jackson, in the district final. Six of the 15 members of that team still live in Yankton. The event begins with a social hour at 6 p.m., followed by dinner at 7 p.m. and the induction ceremony at 7:40 p.m.
