is coming, and I want to be part of that." And even though Wagner — population of just under 1,600 — has had players land at the DJ level before St. Pierre, it's still a big deal in the Charles Mix County town. "It's a big deal to have a kid from Wagner go through a process like this," Red Raiders coach Jason Knebel said. "I think it's a little eye-opening for Noah to see he can opportunities at that level, but that's what he wanted." A 6-foot-1, 170-pound speedster, St. Pierre scored a total of nine touchdowns as a senior for the Red Raiders last fall — with scores in four different ways. He caught 22 passes for 466 yards and six touchdowns, and rushed 22 times for 114 yards and a score. St. Pierre also returned a kickoff and a punt for touchdowns. Over his career, in which he started since his freshman year, St. Pierre recorded a total of 26 touchdowns — 15 as a receiver, five as a rusher, and three each on kick returns. But it's on defense, where St. Pierre likes to make the biggest impact, he said. He finished his Wagner career with totals of 149 tackles and 12 interceptions. "I love playing defense," St. Pierre said. "You have to play hard-nosed football. You have to have that chip on your shoulder; have to be fired up." The issue of where to harness that energy, though, was a whole different challenge.

St. Pierre's older brother, Solomon, is a defensive back at the University of Sioux Falls, while another former Wagner standout Tait Johannsen is a tight end at USD. So yes, there was some persuading of Noah to follow them. "My brother was pushing me, saying we could have a couple more years together because we had success in high school," Noah said. "But once I got to SDSU and toured it, it felt like home." And at his new home, St. Pierre figures to embrace the challenge, Knebel said. "He's excited for that new beginning; that new life," the coach said. "The kid works hard in the off-season, he's dedicated in the weight room, and he sees himself getting better."
