Spike Jonze's New Film, *Her*; Doesn't Disappoint Viewers





Jonze broke onto the scene with Being John Malkovich and Adaptation, both written by Charlie Kaufman, but Jonze's newest film, *Her*, is his second film as both writer and director, and in it he shows his skill.
