What Is Love? Understanding God's Love

The song "What Is Love" by Haddaway was popularized when Will Ferrell and Chris Kattan head-bobbed their way onto dance floors in the film "Night at the Roxbury." With that song's thumping beat now stuck in our heads, that's the question that we ask ourselves on this "day of love" - Valen-

So what is love? In the ancient Greek language, there are four words that are translated as "love"-storge, philia, eros, and agape. Storge (which isn't in the Bible) means the natural affection between a parent and child-a "motherly" love. Philia (used a handful of times in the Bible) means friendship through common interests or activities by being cordial and kind to one another; think of Philadelphia, which is Greek for "brotherly love." Eros (which also isn't in the Bible) is where we get our English word "erotic" and means emo-

mantic, sexual lovethis is generally what we mean by falling or being "in love."

But the word most overwhelmingly used in God's Word for "love" is agape. It's also the most uncommon word for "love" used in secular ancient Greek writings.

Agape is true love and is an unconditional, self-sacrificial love demonstrated by our actions-not emotions-that fully puts the needs of another before our

This is the word used in John 15 when Jesus said, "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:12-13 ESV, emphasis added). The greatest act of agape love is to lay down your life for

Christ did for you and for the entire world when He sacrificed Himself on the cross to save you from eternal torment because of sin and our failure to love one another as Christ loved us.

No, we can't love perfectly the way that Jesus did-that's why so many relationships get messed up and husbands and wives, parents and children, boyfriends and girlfriends, friends and neighbors have problems and conflict. Often these conflicted relationships leave us lamenting, "Baby, don't hurt me; don't hurt me, no more."

Cards, chocolates, flowers, and candle-light dinners can be wonderful expressions of love, but they don't remove the hurt that's caused when a relationship is broken due to our sin and failure to love perfectly. Only Jesus' love is perfect, as He is the only one who could free us from the hurt of our sinfulness when He lay down His life for you and for me with His perfect, selfsacrificial agape act on the cross. Now that is love!

Spring Theology Institute At SHM To Focus On Religious Fundamentalism

The March 15 Theology Institute at Sacred Heart Monastery will focus on a phenomenon that influences culture and politics as well as various religions in many countries today: Religious fundamentalism. Leslie J. Hoppe, a Franciscan priest and Professor of Old Testament at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, will present "Religion and Modernity: The Fundamentalist Response," at 9:00 a.m.-noon in the monastery chapter room. Fr. Hoppe first began teaching a course in religious fundamentalism because of requests from a number of CTU students, who represent numerous countries and religious affiliations. In addition, he has lectured on this topic to a wide variety of audi-

decades, he has had a unique opportunity to observe as well as study the motivations and effects of religious fundamentalism in several religions,

Christian and non-Christian. The presentation will begin by describing the origins of fundamentalism, a term coined as a self-description by conservative American Protestants of various denominations that rejected certain views of early twentieth century liberal Protes-

tantism. After describing basic beliefs of Protestant fundamentalism, Fr. Hoppe will include discussion of the fundamentalist impulse in Roman Catholicism and other world religions such as Judaism and Islam.

The presentation, which will include opportunity for questions, is open to the public free of charge.
