The men have struggled through some well-documented (myself included) problems on the road, losing six straight conference games since a 3-0 start. USD lost a pair of home games to North Dakota State and South Dakota State by a combined five points.

Including Thursday's loss at Fort Wayne, the Coyote men are now 1-11 in road games this season — and that doesn't include a 1-point overtime loss to Wyoming in a game moved to Rapid City. It's hard to pinpoint exactly why the men's team cannot win on the road (I haven't covered a true

road game this season), but it's easy to see that those problems are cause for concern Depending on how the Coyotes fare today (Saturday) at last-place IUPUI, the USD men could


be jeopardy of falling into the seventh seed for the Summit League Tournament. On the other side of things, the Coyote women's team has won four of its last five games since

starting 0-4 in Summit League action USD hosts first-place IUPUI (which is tied with South Dakota State) today at 2 p.m. A win there could go a long way toward vaulting the Coyotes into the No. 3 spot in the standings - which is exactly where they were picked.

A lot is still yet to be determined in conference play, but at this point, those pre-season projections are proving to be rather accurate.


