Beringer Powers Aberdeen Past YHS

ABERDEEN — Yankton gave Leah Beringer an inch, and she took every bit of it.

Beringer poured in 31 points from all over the floor to lead Aberdeen Central to a 61-47 Eastern South Dakota Conference girls' basketball victory over the Gazelles Saturday afternoon at Golden Eagles

"She knocked down a lot of shots," said Yankton head coach Doug Pesicka. "Granted, she had a lot of open looks early. We just didn't find her. didn't get to her. But you still have to knock them down, and she did.

Beringer was 4-for-5 from long range and had 24 points by halftime. She finished with 31 points on 13-of-18 shooting and five treys on the afternoon.

"She got off to a great start," said Central head coach Dawn Seiler. "She got the benefit of some really good passes. I thought the ball moved well today, and we found her in the corner a couple times. She's one of those streaky shooters that once she gets a little bit of confidence, she's someone who can really fill it up.'

The long ball wasn't the only thing working for Beringer. The senior needed less than five seconds to put the Golden Eagles on the board off a breakaway on the opening tip. She also picked up layups and driving buckets in the lane. including one over Yankton's 6foot-5 freshman center Josey Sayler, inserted into the line-up in an effort to disrupt life in the paint for Central. "We swung the ball really

well," said Beringer. "We moved it fast, and the defense didn't have time to catch up. All the teammates knew where everyone was at. We just played together tonight.'

Beringer's opening deluge opened up a 21-point lead in the second quarter for the Golden Eagles, who led 36-17 at

Yankton, however, refused to go quietly. After Central spread the gap to 23 points with back-to-back Mia Bergan buckets to open the third quarter, the Gazelles went on the offensive.

Yankton ripped off a 12-1 run to cut the deficit nearly in half, but that would be as close as the Gazelles would get. Ally Steckler and Beringer combined for a 6-2 run to regain

control before Beringer buried her fifth trey of the night just before the quarter break.

"I think that effort is just the result of the kids we put in just playing hard," said Pesicka. "We did some good things in the second half, in terms of making the game a little more competitive.

The Gazelles, who also erased a late deficit in the first meeting between the two teams before falling by two at home, outscored the Golden Eagles in both the third and fourth quarters, but could not overcome the early letdowns.

"We did exactly what we were supposed to do in the first half." said Seiler of her team's defense. "There weren't very many lanes to penetrate. thought we did a good job hedging and helping, and then the second half we just got flat. We were standing around and turning our heads instead of moving our feet."

While Beringer did not score in the fourth quarter, the defensive attention she drew opened up scoring opportunities for other players. Brianna Kusler scored eight of her 15 on the day in the fourth stanza.

'You spend a lot of time preparing for 'Kus,' and when you have Beringer in this case go crazy on you, it makes them pretty tough to guard," said Pesicka. "Aberdeen just executed very well, and they defended us well in the first half.

Kusler and Beringer were the lone players to reach double figures for the Golden Eagles. Bergan added seven points and Steckler six, while Madisyn Waage chipped in the final two points and added seven assists in a starting role. Beringer and Kusler also
