church had prepared a "profit and loss statement" (P&L, as it is called in business) as their monthly financial report. It is a congregation that sees itself as a business. This is a serious misunderstanding of what the church is, and it has repercussions for doing ministry.

Do they expect to pay corporation tax on the "profit" shown in the P&L? No. of course not. Why? Because they are non-profit! Suppose the P&L shows a loss. It did, of course, so they berated the minister for being inadequate as a "rain maker" (another business term).

The church is not a business. It is a non-profit organization, but at best it should operate on a break-even basis. If you finish the year in the black, it means you did not spend enough on mission, ministry and outreach.

A congregation's productivity is not measured in money raised, but in intangible things in the kingdom of God. How many lives were touched with comfort and compassion? How many people had their faith strengthened by effective preaching? How many hungry people were fed? How often did people encounter the risen Christ through the members of the church? How many changed from warming a pew to being a disciple of Christ? Such things as these are priceless, even when they don't enhance the "bottom line" of the P&L.
