The slow-moving winter storm blanketed a large swath of the Plains and Midwest in snow, forcing the cancellation of roughly 2,000 flights, making roads treacherous and forcing some people to rethink their plans to attend Super Bowl parties.

Blizzard conditions developed in Chicago — where more than a foot of snow was expected by evening — and other Midwest locales as the system slowly crept eastward into Pennsylvania and western New York state. Parts of New England still digging out from a storm early last week were readying for vet another round of snow to arrive Sunday and last through Monday. Here's the outlook:

THE STORM

The snowstorm was expected to be the most farreaching of the season to date, stretching from Nebraska to Maine, according to the National Weather Service.

Forecasters also said the storm was moving unusually slowly, meaning accumulations of between 10 to 16 inches of snow are possible for parts of northern Illinois, Indiana and northwest Ohio. Similar amounts of snow are expected for the Northeast later Sunday and throughout Monday.

"It's not wise to travel, unless you have an emergency, said David Beachler a National Weather Service meteorologist in the Chicago area.

Craig Owens, an English professor at Drake University, was one of the many Midwest residents who spent the morning shoveling their driveways.

"I'm not going to make it the gym anyway, so I've got to get a workout somehow," said Öwens, whose home in Des Moines, Iowa, got about 10 inches of snow.

TRAVEL AND OUTAGES

More than 1,950 flights were canceled in the Midwest, the vast majority of which were flights in or out of Chicago's two airports.

LEGISLATOR PAY

At least three measures to hike legislator compensation are expected to be reviewed in the House State Affairs Committee on Wednesday. Rep. Jim Bolin's measures would remove a \$6,000 cap on legislator pay and allow lawmakers to be eligible for the same pay increases that state workers get when the Legislature passes across-theboard raises for public employees as part of the

appropriations process. Bolin said the measures would help attract candidates

to run for office. 'Part of it is a desire to attract a few more people to run for the Legislature," he said. The pay is very low." House Majority Leader

DEADWOOD GAMBLING

A proposal to authorize three new voter-approved games keno, craps and roulette — in Deadwood is expected to be taken up by the Senate State Affairs Committee on Wednesday. Boosters of the historic mining town have pushed the measure as a way to keep Deadwood competitive with other gambling hotspots, and 57 percent of voters supported the proposal on Nov. 4 as part of Amendment Q. Opponents argue gambling

expansions provoke addictions and cause social and financial problems for families in the state.

ELDER ABUSE Sen. David Novstrup has put

forward a proposal to study elder abuse in South Dakota, which is scheduled be heard in the Senate Retirement Laws Committee on Wednesday. South Dakota Supreme Court Chief Justice David Gilbertson urged action against elder abuse in his State of the Judiciary speech in mid-January.

"I think it's looking to the future and making sure that we're protecting people at all ages, especially the elderly, since we're going to have more and more people in that age group," Novstrup said.

The weather led to power outages Sunday, including roughly 18,000 ComEd customers in Illinois, most of them in suburban Chicago. The weather cut power to nearly 8,000 northern Indiana homes and businesses.

SUPER BOWL PARTY SPOILER?

The most intense period of snow in the Midwest was expected to hit Sunday evening, right around game time, meaning the roads could be treacherous for those heading to Super Bowl parties. Potential wind gusts of up to 40 mph were expected, so drivers could face terrible visibility and snarling snow drifts.

Several of the Chicago area's top tourist attractions closed early Sunday because of the weather, including the Shedd Aquarium, Adler Planetarium and Brookfield Zoo.

The city's pizzerias, though, were expecting heavy demand for deliveries during the game. And bars hosting Super Bowl parties said they wouldn't let the weather spoil their plans. Kathi Kreger, manager at

Brendan's Pub, a Patriots' bar on the city's North Side, said locals would still trudge through the snow for the festivities
