with 44 other members of the Sioux Falls Diocese to the rally.

On the way, the participants watched religious movies and prayed together.

"It was very powerful," Buechler said.

Once arriving in D.C., the event offered the group prayer vigils, masses, various rallies, film screenings, numerous speakers and testimonies of abortion experiences.

Buechler said that she was touched by a youth rally she and her mother attended.

"The youth rally, before the march, had thousands of people in attendance," she said. "We listened to Christian music rock and we had many speakers and adoration."

The march started on 1 p.m. that Thursday, a huge event.

"It was overwhelming to see that amount of people there, but it was also very inspiring seeing everyone support the same cause," Becker said.

The March For Life began as a small demonstration, several years opposing the Supreme Court's Roe V. Wade decision that legalized abortion. The march rapidly grew to be the largest pro-life event in the world.

Buechler said that she saw people from every different background and age group at the march. At one point she saw an 80-year-old man that walked the whole parade with his walker.

"It was amazing," she said. "Seeing all the different kinds of people there was the most inspiring part about it for me."

Noel Kusek, an eighth grader at Sacred Heart who also attended the March For Life, said her favorite part was seeing people from various backgrounds come together as one.

"All these people had the same feelings that I did about respecting life," she said. "It didn't matter what religion they were or where they were from. I learned that we could put aside our differences."

Kusek recalled looking back on the march from on top of hill.

"As far as I could see, there was just people marching," she said. "I think that all life needs to be respected. It shouldn't be up to us to end it. And so did all of these people."

The group ended the trip at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception.

"We were anticipating just a small daily mass, but there were thousands of people there," Becker said.

While there, Kusek noticed the place had constructed a chapel representing countries from all around the world.

"It made me really think that I took part in something big because so many people on this planet believe what I believe," Kusek said.

Kusek, Becker and Buechler said because of the trip, their faith has grown. They all plan to attend the March For Life rally again.

"I think that it was a bonding experience for my daughter and (me)," Becker said. "It really is a cause that is worth supporting."

Passick confirmed that neither Shedd nor the driver of the vehicle were employees of Mead Lumber. Passick also noted that since criminal charges would not be filed the name of the driver would not be released.

Emergency services were

dispatched to the incident, which occurred in the 10 block of High Street in Vermillion. Upon arrival, first responders found the subject to have been severely injured and initiated life-saving efforts.

Shedd was transported by ambulance to Sanford Vermillion Hospital, where he was pronounced deceased.
