






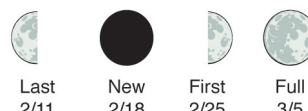

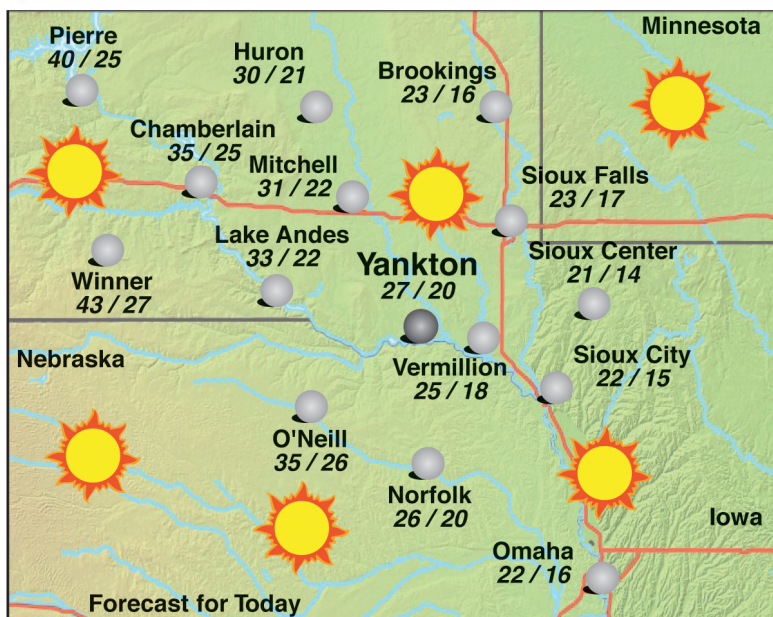

Although handicapped somewhat by the heavy snow and, according to participants, by an attempt to cover too much territory, the Finnish relief benefit jack-rabbit and coyote hunt held yesterday under sponsorship of the Yankton county chapter of Izaak Walton League, turned out quite well, bringing in up to the present time about \$27 to be turned over for relief of Finnish civilians.

Administration farm leaders expressed the belief today that President Roosevelt could be induced to support processing taxes to raise farm aid funds if the major agricultural organizations would unite behind such a program.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, February 5, 1965

Drag racers, dentists and telephone companies were among the odd assortments of business facing

the state Senate today while House members relaxed from the heavy schedule of the past few days.

The 17th annual American Legion Student Government Day activities at Yankton senior high school reached its first climax today with the holding of the primary elections. Large numbers of Federalist and Nationalist party members went to the polls to cast votes for their favorites in an attempt to pick the most formidable candidates for the general election, which will be held on Wednesday, February 10.

25 YEARS AGO
