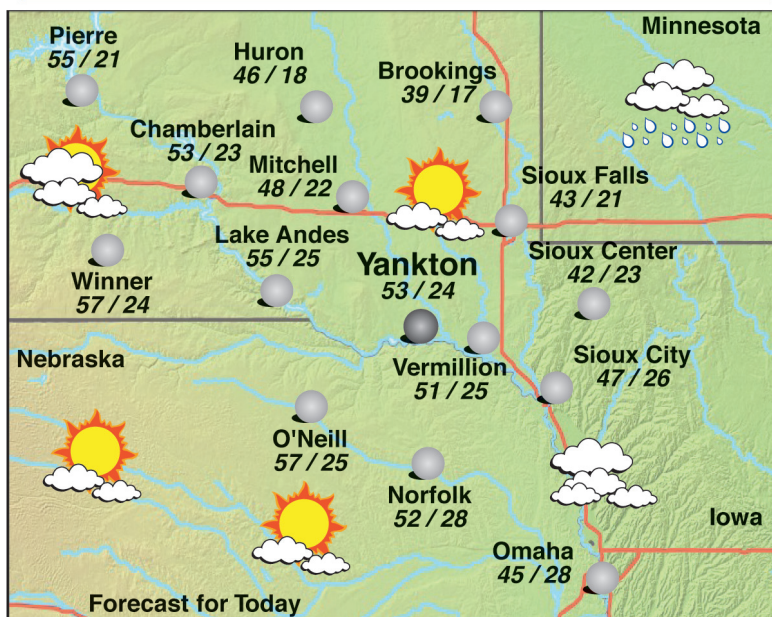

STANTON, Neb. — A Wynot, Nebraska, man has been sentenced to 8-12 years following his conviction of first-degree sexual assault. John Suing, 41, was sentenced Monday by Judge James Kube in Stanton County District Court, according to a news release from the Stanton County sheriff's office. Suing was arrested last year by the Stanton County sheriff's office following an investigation into the assault of a 15-year-old juvenile near Woodland Park. Suing had met the juvenile online. Suing was a registered sex offender at the time and was on probation. Suing had entered a guilty plea last December and faced up to 50 years in prison, according to the sheriff's office.

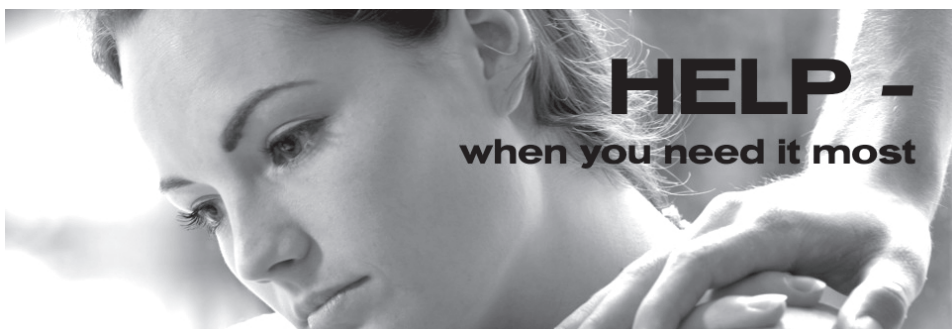
