Melissa Richert of Nebraska Lutheran High School will attend Mount Marty College and play softball for the Lancers, the institution announced on Wednesday.
 Richert, a 5-4 outfielder, helped her club team to a third place finish in the Nebraska state tournament in 2014.
 "After watching her play last August at the Conect Softball Camp, we knew that she would be a good player for us to recruit," said MMC head softball coach Albert Fernandez. "She has the desire and work ethic to continue her development as a college softball player. She is a great student and will fit well with our team and the Mount Marty College community."
 The daughter of Scott and Monica Richert of Gresham, Nebraska, Melissa will be a pre-professional major at MMC. In addition to her softball award, she will receive academic Merit and Scholastica scholarships.

He also recorded the most interception return yards in DII and tied for most interception TD returns with two. St. Pierre had 63 tackles, including 44 solo stops, with two forced fumbles and fumble recovery in 2014. St. Pierre, who has 107 career tackles, tied former Cougars Chuck Morrell (1995-97) and Nick Casiello (1988, 1990-91) for 10th on the career interceptions at USF with 13.
 This season, St. Pierre had 76-yard and 35-yard interception returns and set a school record with 308 interception return yards. He bettered the return yardage mark of Trevor Holleman who had 282 return yards (16 interceptions) from 2006-09. St. Pierre finished just one interception away from tying the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference record of 11 by Jack Moro of St. Cloud State (2011).

USD's Eichkorn, Coyotes Earn UST-FCCCA All-Academic Honors

NEW ORLEANS — South Dakota men's and women's cross country teams and Coyote junior Amber Eichkorn have earned All-Academic honors, according to a release by the U.S. Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches Association on Wednesday.
 Eichkorn was among 153 women in Division I to earn individual All-Academic honors. To be eligible, the honorees must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 and have finished in the top 15 at the NCAA Regionals or as an All-American at the NCAA Championships.
 The Wichita, Kan., native was the top Coyote finisher all fall. Her accolades include a runner-up finish at the Summit League Championships, 10th place at the NCAA Midwest Regional meet, qualifying for the NCAA Championships and earning academic all-Summit League honors. Eichkorn holds a 3.69 GPA and majors in kinesiology and sport science at South Dakota.
 The Coyotes also earned USTFCCCA All-Academic honors as a team. The women recorded a cumulative team GPA of 3.64, which is 28th best out of 226 programs that received the honor. South Dakota was the top program in the Summit League with South Dakota State, North Dakota State, IUPUI and Fort Wayne also receiving the honor.

The men held the 18th best GPA out of 179 teams that earned the honor, with a cumulative team GPA of 3.48. The Coyotes were one of six Summit League programs that received the honor, joining South Dakota State, North Dakota State, Oral Roberts, IUPUI and Fort Wayne.
 To receive All-Academic team status, a program must have a cumulative team GPA of 3.0 or higher and have at least five runners start in a NCAA regional championship.

USF's St. Pierre, Tidwell Honored

PITTSBURG, Kan. — Juniors Solomon St. Pierre and John Tidwell, the #16/18 University of Sioux Falls Football Team's (11-1) talented cornerback duo, has been honored on the 2014 Don Hansen All-America Team announced today.
 St. Pierre, a junior from Wagner, picked up his six All-American honor after being named to the first-team defense. Tidwell, a junior from Aurora, Colo., was named honorable mention All-American.
 Aside from the Don Hansen honor, St. Pierre was named to the D2Football.com First Team, AP Little All-American Team, Dakotans Division II First Team, AFCA Coaches First Team and BeyondSportsNetwork.com First Team.

The selection of St. Pierre gives USF 41 first-team All-Americans all-time with kicker Brian Hansen the first in 1982. In its storied history, USF has had a combined 69 first or second team All-Americans and with Tidwell's honor another 29 have been named honorable mention.

Tidwell and St. Pierre were major contributors on a defense that ranked third nationally in turnovers caused with 40 and fourth in turnover margin at 1.67 (40-to-20). USF was second nationally with 26 interceptions and tied for first with seven defensive TDs (four interception returns) while finishing second in return yardage with 485.

Celebrated Little League Team Stripped Of Title

CHICAGO (AP) — A Little League team that captured the attention of the nation and the hearts of its hometown was stripped of its national title Wednesday after an investigation revealed that team officials had falsified boundaries so they could add ineligible players to the roster.

Only last summer, the all-black Jackie Robinson West team was the toast of Chicago and was honored with trips to San Francisco and to the White House.

But the sport's governing body announced that team officials had engaged in a Little League version of political gerrymandering. Instead of politicians redrawing district maps to pick up votes, it was local league officials who changed the boundaries that determined where players must live. And after learning that their scheme had been exposed, they scrambled to persuade surrounding leagues to go along with what they had done.

"This is so heartbreaking," said Stephen D. Keener, president and CEO of Little League International. "It is a sad day for a bunch of kids who we have come to really like ... who did nothing wrong." But "we cannot tolerate the actions of some of the adults involved here."

The organization suspended the manager, Darold Butler, and suspended the team from Little League tournament play until the local league's president and treasurer have been replaced. A district official who is believed to have helped change the boundaries was also removed.

2010), which houses the football program and is equipped with classrooms, a weight room, an academic room and coaches offices.

• The \$32-million Sanford-Jackrabbit Athletic Complex (SJAC), which opened last fall, houses a 300-meter track and a 100-yard football field with a soy-based synthetic turf.

• And Coughlin-Alumni Stadium — to be newly-named Dana Dykhouse Stadium — is being renovated to increase seating to 19,340 and will be ready for the 2016 season.

Such things may not have been the ultimate deciding factor for recruits, but they certainly didn't hurt, Hale said.

"The indoor facility is obviously a big thing for me being a kicker, being able to practice year-round," he said.

The east and south side grandstands are on track to be completed by the fall of this year, with the entire complex slated for a fall 2016 completion.

Unlike the Dykhouse Center and SJAC, there were only renderings and schematics for recruits to look at during visits.

"That was something I never expected, but once I found out, it was an added bonus," Hale said of the stadium.
