Senate Panel Approves Hike In Legislator Pay

PIERRE (AP) — South Dakota lawmakers could see their salaries nearly double as part of an effort to encourage more people to run for office.

The Senate Appropriations Committee on Thursday voted 6-2 to approve the plan to boost the \$6,000 salary to \$10,000 per regular legislative session. Sen. Craig Tieszen said his proposal is designed to make it easier for residents to make it to Pierre. He said some people don't run for office because the pay is too low. "I think we're at a point where it makes it hard for some people to serve," he said.

The proposal would go

into effect in January 2017, after the next election, Tieszen said. Legislators' last pay raise went into effect in 1999, and lawmaker pay hadn't been increased for a decade before then. Current legislator salaries are set at \$6,000 per regular legislative session — or \$12,000 for a two-year term — plus \$129 per legislative day for living expenses in the 2015 session. Senate Majority Leader Tim Rave, a Republican from Baltic, said he's watched it become more and more difficult to recruit candidates over his 13 years in office. The Legislature typically is in session from mid-January to mid-March. They have

one day at the end of March to consider vetoes. Whether or not the bill passes — similar proposals have failed in the past — Rave said the issue "needs to be brought to the limelight." The House this session has passed several proposals to allow for increases in South Dakota lawmakers' compensation, which is among the lowest in the nation. Two of the proposals work in tandem by saying lawmakers can be paid more than \$6,000-per-session and applying across-the-board pay increases for public workers to legislative salaries too.

Nebraska, with 32 students; Sacred Heart Middle School of Yankton, 30; Gayville-Volin, 18; Andes Central, 13; Laurel-Concord/Coleridge, Neb., 8; and Elkhorn Valley of Tilden, Nebraska, 7.

The Missouri Watershed School Festival had confirmed 20 presenters from federal agencies; South Dakota and Nebraska agencies; private organizations; the University of South Dakota; and the Santee Sioux and Ponca tribes.

The topics cover a wide variety of scientific, historical and cultural topics. The idea is to provide educational information in a hands-on way, showing the rich history and many recreational opportunities on the Missouri River.

The presentations include water safety, cottonwoods, invasive species (zebra mussel, plants and Asian carp), paddling the river, Missouri River geology, pallid sturgeon, wetland ecology and fish of the river.

Other presentations include terns and plovers, a rainfall simulator, a stream table, historical re-enactor, river significance, tribal history and the Missouri National Recreational River's mobile ranger station.

A common thread runs throughout the event - hands-on experiences.

"Kids don't always have the opportunity to get out and involved with nature. They don't get the chance to hold a fish - some have never seen a fish," Robb said. "But we also teach them about things like Missouri River geology. We show how a glacier reacts with global warming. And we have the stream table which shows how quickly the channel of a river can change."

The River Rendezvous, which runs from 1-5 p.m. May 2, also stresses hands-on activities, said Ranger Dugan Smith with the National Park Service.

"We want to offer things that are fun," he

students feel safer by allowing them to concealed carry, and I guess my opposing view of that is, while I want everyone to feel safe, I don't think it's fair to encourage someone's safety and jeopardize another person's thought of safety." Rep. Jim Stalzer, a Republican from Sioux Falls, said his plan was prompted by students who want to defend themselves on college campuses.

The group Students for Concealed Carry says seven states have some form of law governing campus carry. Texas lawmakers were discussing on Thursday whether to legalize concealed handguns on college campuses and open carry everywhere else.

South Dakota lawmakers also debated several proposals to expand where concealed weapons are allowed. A measure to authorize lawmakers to have weapons in the Capitol building if they undergo training was defeated in a Senate committee, which approved a similar measure for sergeants-at-arms.

Stalzer said he wants to work to address some of the concerns with the South Dakota campus carry proposal, but pushed back against students' concerns.

"They go off campus, they go to Walmart, they go to wherever, and if they run into me, they may well have run into a person who is armed," Stalzer said. "I think that's one of the deterrents of our concealed carry laws is you don't know, and that makes it bad for the bad guy."

Republican Rep. Scott Craig, who supported the measure, said he believes it's "very likely" students are already carrying concealed weapons on campus.

Three Republicans joined two Democrats in opposing the plan, but eight supporting votes moves it to the full House of Representatives.

Chelsea Gilbertson, a sophomore at the University of South Dakota who attended the hearing, said the committee's decision frustrated her.

"That's what upsets me most is that they have the audacity to sit up there and listen to us, say, 'you did so well,' and then say, 'but we still don't care about what you think,'" Gilbertson said. "You're not the ones on the campus. Listen to the ones who will be."
