Gazelles Begin State Gymnastics Meet Today

After an up-and down sea-

son, the Yankton Gazelles gymnastics team found just enough to push themselves to state. Today (Friday), they hope to find a little more.

Yankton begins competition in the South Dakota State Gymnastics Meet at the Watertown Civic Arena. Team competition begins today at 11 a.m., with individual competition set for Saturday, beginning at 9:30 a.m.

The Gazelles qualified for state with a fifth place finish in the Eastern South Dakota Conference Championships, which doubled as the Region 2AA meet, last weekend in Pierre. Their score of 132.15 was three-tenths of a point better than 10th place Sioux Falls Lincoln.

"In my 10 years here, we've never had a year with as much of a roller coaster ride as this one," said Yankton head coach Luke Youmans. "The emotional ups and downs, the physical issues, the changes in the demographics of the kids in the program ... there was definitely

a learning curve for our young kids. "At the end of the day, the

only thing that matters is that we are going as a team."

One of the things that

helped at ESD was a strong showing on balance beam. We came together as a

team on beam," said sophomore Haleigh Diede, the lone all-around individual qualifier for the Gazelles. "We can still improve on bars, floor and vault, clean up the little things.

The Gazelles finished sixth at state a year ago with a score that ranks below Yankton's best score this season, but the competition has been tougher in 2014-15 and the Gazelles are missing several key components from that squad, Youmans said.

'We've adjusted our goals a lot so that we don't become too focused on where we finish as a team," he said. "There are still a lot of points left on the table.'

The Gazelles have also had to battle injuries to two of its four sophomores — they started the season with no juniors or seniors. Kaitlin Guthmiller is expected to compete today, but Sophie Bisgard is questionable. The other sopho-more, Morgan Mason, will compete. Freshmen Cameryn Specht and Lauren Vik, eighth grader Samantha Kortan and seventh graders Jaiden Boomsma and Trinity Goeman are also on the state tourna-

ment roster. Since the Gazelles cannot finish lower than their seed, they will give everything they've got to move up, Youmans said.

'We're going to take some chances, roll the dice," he said. We need to put a complete meet together. That hasn't happened yet, but we're holding out hope that it will happen for us this weekend."

Saturday's individual com-petition will feature a limited number of Gazelles.

"It's a tough region, and when (top-seeded) Mitchell has six all-arounders at ESD and they all go, it eats up a lot of spots.

We had some girls right on the bubble that just missed." Diede will compete in all four events, and will be joined

by Mason, Guthmiller and Boomsma on the balance beam. Boomsma and Specht are also qualified on the vault. Diede, who competed in the all-around at state as a freshman, is excited for the oppor-

tunity. "It makes me fell good about myself, that the work has paid off," she said. "It's the one time to do the all-around individually without the pressure of worrying about the team score.

All three area programs are among the nine teams qualified for the team competition of the South Dakota State Class A Gymnastics Meet, scheduled for today (Friday) and Saturday at the Watertown Civic Arena.

First-year co-op Wagner-Bon Homme enters as the third seed at 133.7, trailing only de-fending champion Madison (138.35) and Deuel (134.95). First-year program Parkston-Ethan-Hanson is seeded sixth at 129.325. Vermillion grabbed the final tournament spot with a score of 124.625.

Only one individual champion returns in Class A, Madison's Jenni Giles in the floor exercise. Giles enters with the top score on the floor (9.55) and vault (9.15), shares the top score on the balance beam (8.975) and owns the top all-around score (36.2) from region competition.

Giles shares top honors on the beam with Jada Plastow of Parkston-Ethan-Hanson. Madison's Abby Christiansen has the top region score on the bars coming into state at 8.68.

Team competition will begin at 11 a.m. today, as the team event in both classes goes on at the same time. The individual competition for Class A begins at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday.

Here is a look at the three area teams, listed in order of seed:

Wagner-Bon Homme

The addition of a pair of gymnasts who competed in the Class AA state meet a year ago, as well as others that had been in the gym for the old Yankton-Bon Homme co-op, had a positive effect not just on the program but on the Wagner gymnasts as well, said Wagner-Bon Homme head coach Cherie Petry.

"Our girls from last year knew to earn a spot this sea-son would be tough," she said. They did a lot of preparation for the season, and they are jumping higher, dancing more gracefully.

While Wagner did not qualify for state as a team a year ago, it did return to state placewinning gymnasts from a season ago, senior Hannah Fleming (tied for 15th on bars)

Junior Heidi Hoff again stepped into a starting role, and she responded with five points, five rebounds and three assists. Even short a reserve, the Coyotes still managed to outrebound the Mavericks 40-25 and get 35 points off the bench.

"One girl would do a skill. The next would see it and say, 'If she can do it, I can do it, too," Petry said.


With the higher talent level also comes higher expectations, something Petry hopes do not weigh on her girls
