**MMC Volleyball Adds Three From Rapid City**

RAPID CITY — Three more from the recruiting class lined up by former Mount Marty College volleyball coach Candice Climer have committed to the Lancers, according to a report from the Rapid City Journal. Rapid City Central's Larissa Trainer and Rhea Colombe and St Thomas More's Savannah Sullivan will attend MMC and play volleyball for the

Lancers. Sullivan is reportedly the first-ever Cavalier to play for the Lancer volleyball program. Trainer was a 6-1 middle for the Cobblers this past season. Colombe was a 5-7 setter and right-side hitter. Sullivan was a 5-4 setter. The three join another Rapid City standout, Stevens outside hitter Brooke Bennett, in committing to the Lancers, who have been looking for a head coach since Climer resigned last month to take a full-time teaching position. MMC was 12-21 overall, 4-12 in the GPAC in 2014. The Lancers earned a berth in the GPAC post-season tournament, failing to eventual champion Northwestern.

**USD Football Hands Out Team Awards**

VERMILLION — Junior wide receiver Eric Shufford and junior linebacker Keyen Lage were among the award recipients at the 2014 University of South Dakota Football Awards Show held recently in the ballroom of the Muenster University Center. Shufford was named both Henry Heider Most

Valuable Player of the Year and Dave Triplett Offensive Player of the Year. He led the Coyotes with 53 catches for 699 yards and five touchdowns, and was named to the MVFC All-Newcomer Team. Shufford was in his first season at South Dakota after playing his sophomore season at San Bernardino Valley College near his hometown of Rialto, Calif. Lage was named Joe Salem Defensive Player of the Year. He started all 12 games at outside linebacker and finished with 66 tackles, the fourth-highest tally on the team. Lage, who hails from Sioux Falls, had 5.5 tackles-for-loss, five pass breakups and one forced fumble.

Sophomore Miles Bergner was named Beanie Cooper Special Teams Player of the Year. Bergner made a record 16 consecutive field goals to start the season. He finished as the fourth-most accurate kicker in the nation and with the 16th-most makes. Bergner was also the nation's 17th-leading punter in terms of yards per attempt (41.9) and had 17 punts of 50 yards or more. Senior right guard Andrew Schofield, who started 31 consecutive games spanning the last three seasons, was named Tim McFarland Line-

man of the Year. Sophomore linebacker John Wessel, the team's second-leading tackler with 86 stops, earned the Coaches Award. Freshman Brandon Godsey, who handled long snapping duties for the team, was named Harry Gamage Most Valuable Freshman. First-year wide receiver Paul Anderson received the Offensive Scout Player of the Year award and redshirt freshman linebacker Taylor Lambert received Defensive Scout Player of the Year. Sophomore fullback Drew Potter received the Tim Mojzik Bulldog Award. This award is chosen by the members of the Coyote Football team to honor the person best exemplifying the attributes of tenacity, courage, endurance, and fortitude. Potter served as lead blocker for a run game that averaged 166 yards a contest. He netted 103 yards rushing on eight carries and had 73 yards receiving with a touchdown.

The state's returning Gatorade Player of the Year, the 6-foot, 170-pound senior midfielder scored 24 goals and passed for 13 assists this past season, leading the Chargers (10-2-2) to the Class A state championship game. He concluded his prep soccer career with 67 goals and 31 assists.

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — Eric Robertson's tip-in with eight seconds left gave South Dakota a 74-73 victory over Omaha on Thursday night.

Brandon Bos' jumper with 58 seconds left brought South Dakota within one, 73-72. Tre'Shawn Thurman, who had scored Omaha's four previous points to give the Mavericks the lead, missed a jumper. The Coyotes got the rebound, missed two shots then got the winner on Robertson's tip.

The Coyotes had a last chance but CJ Carter missed and Mike Rostampour couldn't tip in the rebound.

The game was tied when Omaha (8-16, 2-10 Summit) went on an 11-0 run to lead 61-50 with nine minutes left. South Dakota rallied and led 70-69 with two minutes to go.
