who was visiting the Yankton area during homecoming week, was reported missing on Sept. 18, 1992, after attending a house party in Cedar County, Nebraska, with her boyfriend, Eric Stukel. Haas was found dead in a ravine south of the Crofton Lakeview Golf Course five days later. The *Press & Dakotan* reported in 2012 that an Iowa medical examiner determined Haas had died of a neck injury and had sustained other injuries. Authorities said they believed she'd been dragged into the ravine. In 1995, Stukel was charged with class III felony manslaughter in Haas' death and found not guilty. The case has been cold ever since.

The "Justice" founder said there has been some notice as a result of the page's foundation.

"Right now, we have three or four major news outlets that have contacted us," he

said. "Unsolved Mysteries" has reached out to us; "Date-line" has reached out to us; "Dr. Phil," but he wants from ... the Stukel side; also PSG Films, who makes shows for National Geographic (Channel) and Discovery (Channel) and they're doing a new show of cold cases."

The awareness campaign has also caught the attention of Daniel DeGroff, who was once a classmate of Tammy's younger brother, Paul.

DeGroff, through crowd-funding site YouCaring.com, is attempting to raise money to help aid in further investigation into Tammy's death.

"Earlier this year is when I became aware of the 'Justice For Tammy Haas' Facebook page that's been put together and (I) started reading through that," DeGroff said. "A lot of the conversations kind of ended up about would it help if there was money that we could raise for new information. I just kind of decided I'd do my part and ... created a fundraising site to try and raise money to either hire a private investigator or put up a reward."

DeGroff said reception of the fundraising effort has been positive so far.

spent more than \$1.6 million.

"We feel great about where she is," Noem campaign consultant Justin Brasell said. "We feel good about what we've accomplished, and we want to keep adding to Congresswoman Noem's level of support in the state."

South Dakota Democratic Party Chairwoman Ann Torn-

berg called their bank accounts "formidable," but said the party is working hard to put a Democrat back in South Dakota's congressional delegation.

Minnehaha County Commissioner Jeff Barth, who unsuccessfully ran in December to chair the state Democratic party, said he thinks Democrats made a mistake allowing Thune to run unopposed in 2010. He said those seats shouldn't be given up without a fight, but acknowledged his party's disadvantage in the state.

"There's always the chance

"I've had that open for just a couple of weeks now," he said. "We're closing in on \$2,500. I've got it initially set up for a two-month fundraiser and we'll see how far we get. ... Several people have contacted me when they've donated saying this won't be their last donation."

As of Friday evening, the project had raised \$2,429 from 46 donors with 46 days left to donate. The goal is to raise at least \$10,000.

The Facebook page is also looking to possibly hold its own fundraiser later in the summer or fall, working with the Haas family.

DeGroff said he sees a greater potential to find some closure for the family thanks to the raised profile that social media can bring to a case.

"Just the fact that we have social media and the ability to communicate and coordinate and organize and discuss couldn't have been done 20, 10 years ago," he said. "Seems like there's a lot of momentum and people talking about it. I'm hopeful that somebody has a conscience heavy enough to speak up."

The "Justice" founder said the response to their effort has varied.

"It's very hard," he said.

"They've made a lot of people feel pretty bad. We had one (administrator) who had enough and left because she was getting harassed. There's family of the Stukels and (others suspected) that have said some harsh things. ... But then the support is just crazy. The inbox is flooded. A lot more people will send a letter every single day saying, 'Keep going.' We know that the support is really high, but we also know that there is a group of people that are furious."

The "Justice" founder added that he, too, is confident that the recently elevated profile of the case could produce a resolution.

"We think social media is a huge key to (solving the case)," he said. "This is going to help solve a lot of murder cases in the future because it's hard to hide from this. It makes people feel the pressure to have to step up."

and her husband moved to Arkansas where she got a job at the headquarters of Tyson Foods while her husband was getting his masters degree.

"I worked in research development," she said. "I was working in value-added meal solutions."

Though she liked her job and the warm weather in Arkansas, Hollenbeck said that she was homesick for the Midwest.

"It was hard being 10 hours away from your family, especially since we are so close," she said. "It is not

something you can just come home quick for the weekend to go to an event."

Hollenbeck said everything fell into place after landing a job as the new youth program advisor while her husband works at Beef Products Inc.

"Lauren has a lot of responsibility because she has the three counties where she oversees what is going on in each one," said Stephanie Siebrandt, 4-H youth development coordinator. "Here in Yankton County, she will have a big role in all of our main events. She will have many of her own programs, such as youth activities and after-school programs, and help me with mine as well."

With Hollenbeck as a new addition, Siebrandt said Yankton County has a huge

advantage compared to the other counties because they will have twice of what the other counties get.

"We have the advantage here because we can work together and use both sources to make programs bigger and better than we could with just one of us," she said. "It is going to be easier to have another body — another person who knows what is going on. She will really help answering people's questions and really run the show. When we go to the state fair, it will be nice having another person there representing Yankton County and help our 4-Hers."

Hollenbeck said she is looking forward to the state fair in Huron this summer and hopes to get more kids in the area involved with 4-H.

"I think 4-H gives kids a lot more opportunities to experience things they might not have been able to at school or at home," she said. "4-H provides a lot of experiences for the youth. I did stuff at the county level that I would have not been able to alone or at home."

Siebrandt said that Hollenbeck is a great addition to the 4-H team.

"We are really excited to have Lauren," she said. "We can't wait to see how she will show her strengths here in Yankton County to complement what we already have going on."

Authorities believe that after the shooting, DeZeeuw left the building and began driving the semitrailer. They said he then killed himself after setting the Plains Xpress semitrailer on fire. Next to his body was a handgun, which Johnson said was "consistent" with the shell casing found at the site of the shooting.

No suicide note was found

at DeZeeuw's Sioux Falls home, which was searched Thursday evening. It wasn't clear whether he was a contractor or direct employee of Sioux Steel's ProTec Engineered Buildings division.

DeZeeuw's background included various minor traf-

fic offenses, and an arrest for assault and disorderly conduct in 2001. Those charges were later dropped. In 2008, DeZeeuw mailed a feces-smearing traffic ticket to the clerk of courts in Minnehaha County and was sentenced to three years of probation.

Sioux Steel is offering counseling for its employees, and issued a statement saying it is cooperating with law enforcement agencies. The state's Division of Criminal Investigation will continue to investigate.
