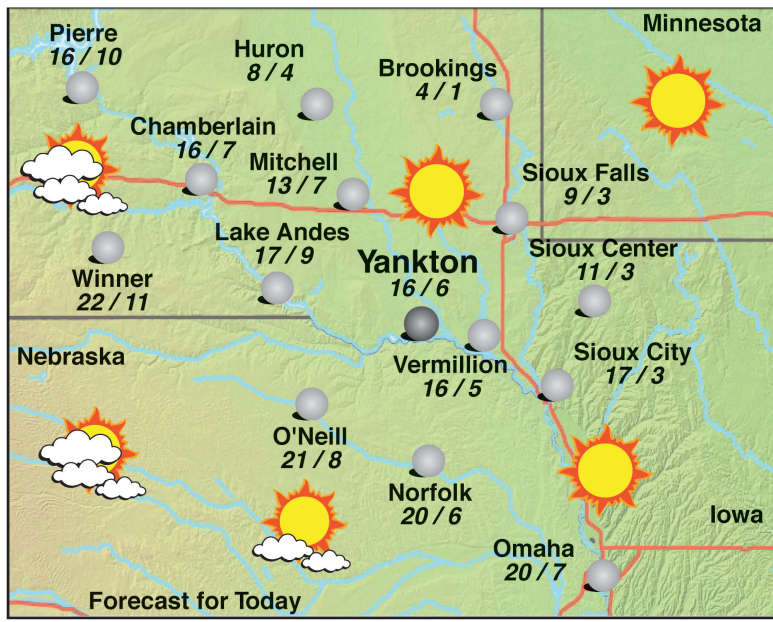

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for March delivery gained 11.75 cents to \$5.33 a bushel; March corn was up 4.25 cents to 3.875 cents a bushel; March oats rose 4.25 cents to \$2.8725 a bushel; while March soybeans advanced 6.75 cents to \$9.9050 a bushel. Beef and pork were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. April live cattle was up 2.10 cents to \$1.5322 a pound; March feeder cattle rose 3.55 cents to \$1.2385 a pound; while April lean hogs were 1.52 cents higher at \$6.602 a pound.

Board Announces Programs Eligible For Build Dakota Scholarship

PIERRE — The Build Dakota Scholarship Board announced the 54 program options within eight, high-need industry areas that will be covered in the first year of the scholarship program. The industry areas covered are as follows: Automotive, Building Trades/Construction, Energy Technicians, Engineering Technicians, Licensed Practical Nursing (select programs), Medical Lab Technicians, Precision Manufacturing, Welding. For a complete list of the program options at South Dakota's four technical institutes, go to http://doe.sd.gov/builddakota. Scholarship applications will be available Feb. 17. The scholarship is available for new, incoming students in the 2015-16 school year. It is expected that approximately 300 scholarships will be awarded in the first year. In-state and out-of-state students are eligible to apply. Scholarship applicants must be accepted into their program of interest. Recipients of the scholarship must enroll full-time and complete their educational program on schedule. The Build Dakota Scholarship will cover tuition and fees, books, equipment and other related program expenses. Scholarship recipients will commit to stay in South Dakota to work in their field of study for three years following graduation. The Build Dakota Scholarship program was announced in late 2014. It is made possible by a \$25 million donation from T. Denny Sanford and a \$25 million grant by Gov. Dennis Daugaard from the South Dakota Future Fund. Build Dakota aims to support students entering high-need workforce programs at South Dakota's technical institutes to fill the state's technical career fields with skilled professionals.

Vietnam Memorial Celebration Set

In honor of the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam Conflict, a memorial celebration is being planned in the Pierre/Fort Pierre area for the weekend of March 28-29. The event will kick off with a mixer at the American Legion Post No. 8 in Pierre on Saturday evening, March 28, running from 6-10 p.m. On Sunday, March 29, there will be a parade starting in Fort Pierre and proceeding to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial at the Capitol Lake area in Pierre. A memorial wreath ceremony will be held and following that ceremony will be remarks from various dignitaries. As more details become available, the Yankton County Veterans Service Office will provide such information to the Press and Dakotan. March 30 has been designated as "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" and will be observed as a working holiday. All veterans are welcome to attend this memorial celebration.

WALL ST. RECAP

The Standard & Poor's 500 index climbed to a record high Friday as the energy sector continued to rebound with the climbing price of oil. Some encouraging earnings news from major companies also bolstered stocks. The Dow Jones industrial average remains 35 points short of its all-time high.
ON FRIDAY: The Dow Jones industrial average rose 46.97, or 0.3 percent, to 18,019.35. The Standard & Poor's 500 index gained 8.51 points, or 0.4 percent, to 2,096.99. The Nasdaq composite climbed 36.22, or 0.8 percent, to 4,893.84.

FOR THE WEEK: The Dow Jones industrial average rose 195.06 points, or 1.1 percent. The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 41.52 points, or 2 percent. The Nasdaq composite rose 149.44 points, or 3.2 percent.
FOR THE YEAR: The Dow is up 196.28 points, or 1.1 percent. The S&P 500 index is up 38.09 points, or 1.9 percent. The Nasdaq is up 157.78 points, or 3.3 percent.
