Bon Homme-Scotland won four titles and claimed eight top-six finishes in the tournament, including heavyweight Dan Stibral (25-0) remaining unbeaten by handing Aberdeen Central's Sam Schuamann (29-1) his first loss of the season, a 1-0 decision. Duncan Stoebner improved to 34-0 with his 120-pound title. Stas Sutera (113) and Alex Caba (132) also won crowns.

Also for the Bucks, Cody Vornhagen finished fourth at 113 pounds to score his 30th victory of the season (31-19). Bashir Abd-Al-Kreem placed fifth at 120 pounds. Brock Folkers finished sixth at 195 pounds.

Both Yankton and Bon Homme-Scotland will begin post-season action this week. Yankton will compete in the Region 2A meet on Thursday and Friday. Bon Homme-Scotland travels to Parkston on Saturday for the Region 3B meet.

selection was good. When you take good shots, usually your shooting percentage is pretty good."

The win was in stark contrast to the first meeting between the two teams. Central claimed a defensive 34-27 win over Yankton back on Jan. 24.

"It's just a different night," Norberg explained. "That game that we played down there was just a game where neither team could get out of its own way. We couldn't score. Both teams were playing really good on defense."

That defensive pressure carried over for the Golden Eagles, who held Yankton to just 37 percent from the field and 11 percent from three-point range. The Bucks were forced to shoot the long ball after losing three players to foul trouble, including starting post players Evan Greenewald and Bradley Sorenson.

"I've been happy with our defense the last two games, especially on the perimeter," Norberg said. "Inside, I thought we double-teamed a little early and were late on some sinks. We may be getting a little picky

here, but a couple times we gave up a layup on that. Overall I thought we were pretty consistent defensively the last two games."

Bachmeier led Central with 15 points followed by LeGrand's 14. TJ Allam and Hannigan tossed in eight apiece.

Sorenson, who got the start for the injured Hale, led all players with 18 points, while Tanner Frick added 10 points and seven rebounds.

"We're still optimistic that Brady will back this year, but we do need to find a new identity without him," Haynes said. "That's unfortunate and it's tough to do in the middle of February to redefine your identity and redefine roles, but that's where we're at and that's what we need to do."

Winners of nine straight, the Golden Eagles now turn their attention to a pair of road games next week. Central will travel to Huron on Tuesday and Watertown on Saturday before wrapping up the regular season at home on Feb. 24.

"We're fortunate right now that we have an opportunity, if we win the games on our schedule, to win some things that we want," Norberg said. "The conference is a big deal for us, but we have a long way to go. We still have three games."

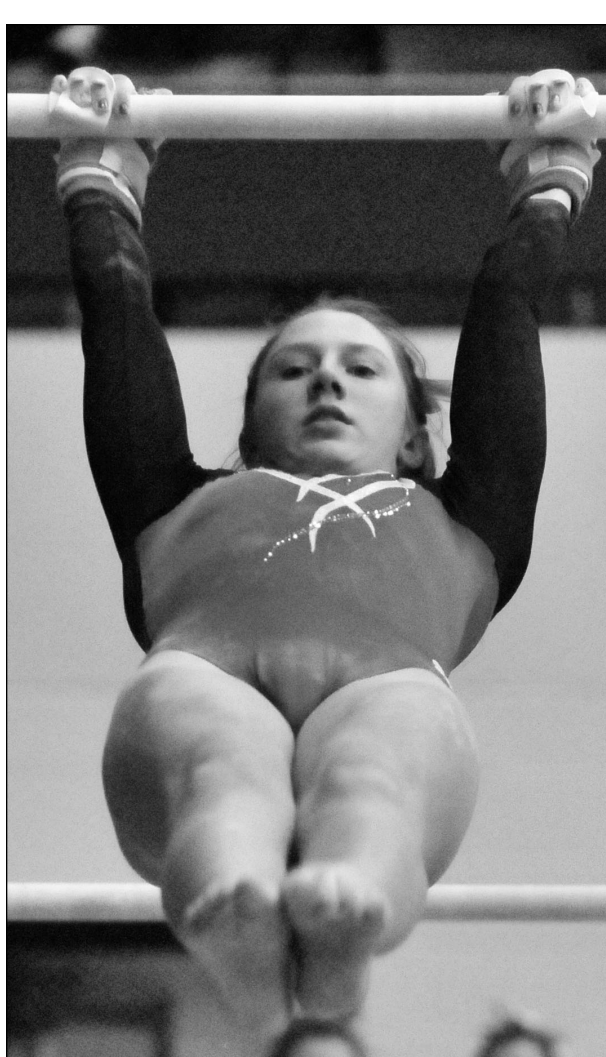
Creighton (19-4) also got five points from Natalie Nielsen and five rebounds apiece from Eggerling and Sorenson.

Hannah Fleming (34.175) finished eighth and ninth to cap a strong weekend. Also in the all-around, P-E-H eighth grade McKenzie Prunty (34.05) finished 11th, Vermillion eighth grader Carter Williams (33.95) finished 12th, W-BH eighth grader Emily Duffek (33.225) finished 16th and Vermillion junior Cheyenne Mallory (32.7) finished 20th.

Hisek placed in all four events for W-BH, placing second on bars (8.55), tied for 14th on floor (8.8), 15th on beam (8.2) and tied for 17th on vault (8.65). Fleming earned a pair of top-10 finishes, tied for fourth on bars (8.425) and tied for eighth on floor (8.875). Duffek also earned a pair of top-10 finishes, seventh on floor (8.925) and 10th on bars (8.225).

"They all got to shine today," said Wagner-Bon Homme head coach Cherie Petry. "They all did well, but they know they still have room to grow."

Petry was happy to send her seniors out on a high note, not only with Saturday's performance but the team's runner-up finish on Friday as well.

"It will be hard to lose our six-year senior (Fleming), and Chelsey has been just fantastic," she said. "Our seniors have led by example, the way they've carried themselves."

Duffek is one of three 2015 medal winners the squad will return next season, as Rachel

Dion (8.95) finished sixth and Adrian Weber (8.775) tied for eighth on the vault. That, combined with the team success, have the squad already looking ahead.

Plastow also medaled in all four events, including a runner-up finish on floor (9.25). She also finished seventh on vault (8.825), 11th on bars (8.2) and 17th on beam (8.125).

P-E-H had two others on the awards stand, with Prunty taking home three medals in addition to her all-around performance: fourth on floor (9.15), seventh on bars (8.4) and tied for 20th on beam (8.0). Seventh grader Tyra Zens finished 12th on beam (8.35) and tied for 19th on floor (8.75).

After struggling on team day, the young P-E-H squad took home 11 of a possible 16 medals on Saturday.

"Today was different, not having the pressure of the team aspect. That helped a lot," said Parkston-Ethan-Hanson head coach Bridget Muntefering. "I kept reminding this is for themselves, and to show what they've got, do their best and have fun."

P-E-H took seven gymnasts to Watertown this weekend, none older than a freshman.

"It's going to be interesting to see how next year goes," Muntefering said. "Our girls walk away from this already having goals for next year. They know what it takes, and they're highly motivated."

Vermillion's Williams and Mallory each claimed three medals on the day, with Williams leading the way with a runner-up finish on balance beam (8.925) and a tie for 11th on floor (8.825). Mallory tied for 17th on floor (8.775) and 20th on bars (7.775).

"We wanted them to go out and give it their best shot," said Vermillion head coach Shannon Fitzsimmons. "Each deserved those medals. They should be proud of all the success they've had this season."

Williams' runner-up finish was the highest Tanager placing in several years, but the eighth grader is driven more by improving, Fitzsimmons said.

"Carter doesn't just want success," she said. "She wants to learn what it takes to be the best."

The Tanagers took nine gymnasts to Watertown, including three that competed on Saturday. None of those gymnasts graduate in May.

"The most exciting part is that we don't have any seniors," Fitzsimmons said. "All of our girls gained a lot of experience. Hopefully they learned from that and will be even stronger next season."
