PIERRE — Approximately \$2.7 million is available for funding during the February 2015 application cycle for the South Dakota Housing Opportunity Fund (HOF). HOF can be utilized to assist communities in addressing their local housing needs.

Any for-profit, nonprofit entity, tribal government, housing authority, political subdivision of South Dakota or agency of South Dakota is eligible to apply for funding.

The Housing Opportunity Fund may be used for new construction or the purchase and rehabilitation of rental or homeownership housing. It may also be used for homelessness prevention activities, community land trusts and housing preservation — including home repair or to make homes more accessible to individuals with disabilities.
