Where should the South Dakota High School Activities Association place its state tournaments?
That seems to be a question that everyone has an answer for, but not a lot of groups have the same answer.
Smaller communities that are currently in tournament rotations are feeling threatened by the completion of the Sanford Premier Center in Sioux Falls, expecting a push from the Sioux Falls Sports Authority to give all the hoops tournaments (boys and girls, all three classes) a permanent home there.
Here are the questions that should be at the top of people's minds when considering where state tournaments should be held:

Time For Serious Debate About S.D. Tournament Hosting

- 1) Does a community have more than adequate facilities to host the event? Does it have more than adequate accommodations?
 - 2) What is the fan/student-athlete experience for those times when they are not at the arena?
 - 3) Is the community a "good" host?
- The third criteria can make up for some lacking in the second. For example, I have enjoyed tournament in Huron despite there being little to do away from the arena. But the first criteria has to take precedent.
- We are about a month away from state basketball tournament weekends, and it is already nearly impossible to reserve a room online in any state tournament community not named Rapid City or Sioux Falls. Some of the issues have nothing to do with the basketball tournaments — Brookings is out of rooms due to state var-

ity boys' hockey also being in town that weekend.
Because of our location — just over two blocks from the Nebraska border — I have plenty of experience in dealing with the Nebraska state tournament, which has six classes in Lincoln on the same weekend. Last year's girls' tournament averaged 1,166 per game, the boys 1,773. (I could not find S.D. numbers online, but would suspect that any big winner's bracket games would be negated by sparsely-attended consolation games.)
Volleyball seems on track to bring its tournaments together in the Premier Center in the near future. Basketball would take two or three facilities, but could be done.
While many fans are fighting the move as they wave their community banner, I think one well-organized three-class hoops tournament weekend might change their minds.

Man Accused Of Spilling Beer, Using Racial Slurs at gGame

(AP) — A South Dakota man was charged Wednesday with disorderly conduct for allegedly spilling beer on and using racial slurs toward a group of Native American students last month at a Rapid City Rush hockey game.
The misdemeanor charge against 41-year-old Trace O'Connell is the result of a nearly monthlong investigation into events at a Jan. 24 game. Chaperones for the students from the American Horse School in Allen have said the children and their chaperones left the game early because of the harassment.
O'Connell's attorney, Patrick Duffy, said Wednesday that his client disputes the charge and that he did not use racial slurs or spray beer on the students. Duffy wouldn't go into details about what happened during the game, saying O'Connell's side of the story would come out in court.
He said stories of what happened during the game at Rushmore Plaza Civic Arena have become "progressively unhinged" on social media.
"The story was told long before the facts had been revealed," he said.
Jodi Richards, the middle school principal at the American Horse School, said school officials and parents were "deflated" when they heard about the misdemeanor charge. In response, Richards said the school is looking at whether federal hate crime charges could be filed.
Rapid City and Pennington County officials went to the American Horse School on Wednesday to discuss the results of the investigation, but said the meeting grew tense and they decided to leave early for safety reasons. In a news release, Rapid City police spokesman Brendyn Medina described the meeting as "chaotic with frustration and high emotions."
Richards said the account from officials was a "definite over-exaggeration." "People were asking a few questions," she said. "It did not get heated."
The alleged harassment has sparked an outcry from Native American and civil rights advocates in western South Dakota about underlying racism in the region. Earlier this month, Bryan Brewer, former president of the Oglala Sioux Tribe, formed a group to confront racism in response to the events at the hockey game. John Yellow Bird Steele, the tribe's current president, told the Argus Leader on Wednesday that he had hoped for stiffer charges.
"I believe the charges are watered down," Steele said.
