We had really handcuffed ourselves as a conference as to who could host," Bernatow said. The prior format required a host site to have two available fields, something most of the league could not provide. "Kyle had a really good year last season, as did Alex," Bernatow said. "Dustin started at the end of the year last season. A.J. received a medical redshirt — he was at the allowable limit, so we're fortunate to have him.'

The Lancers return solid pitchers for middle relief and non-conference starts, and have a pair of seniors at the back end. Senior Dakota Kirkman (1-2, 5.23 ERA, 9 K in 20 2/3 IP), junior Josh Teichroew (0-0, 6.06 ERA, 5 K in 16 1/3 IP) and sophomore Michael Sadler (1-1, 2.84 ERA, 11 K in 19 IP) all return in the bullpen. Seniors Bryton Carlson (1-0, 1 save, 0.00 ERA, 5 K in $3\dot{2}/3$ IP) and Derrik Nelson (1-2, 5.20 ÉRA, 16 K in 27 2/3 IP in 2012) could both be utilized in the closer role.

"At the back end we'll be in a better situation, being able to use Carlson and Nelson in close games," Bernatow said. "They both have high-end velocity and the right mentality. They both can suit the role just fine."
