WAGNER — High school juniors realize spring is approaching and so is the ACT exam. For many high school juniors, this is a time of great anxiety as they realize this is the time to take the next serious step towards final preparation for college entrance. Most juniors are very aware that the test determines their admission opportunities for school and their competition status for many scholarships. This concern often creates a great deal of worry for these students as they are beginning to prepare for their life after high school. They realize that, just like in any sporting event, if you don't prepare properly you are more likely to face a difficult road ahead.

To help students feel less anxious and better prepared, many will begin reviewing for this important exam in a variety of ways. Some students will go to the ACT web site, www.actstudent.org, to begin preparing on their own. Some will purchase a study guide to prepare on their own while others will choose to have guided practice be taking a preparation course, such as the "Wagner" Area — ACT Test Prep Course."

This particular "preparation course" is de-

ACT Test Prep Course offers students the opportunity to thoroughly prepare for the exam by providing instruction on specific test strategies, an opportunity for questions and answers, test practice in each of the sub-test areas and also provides a complete test simulation prior to the April test date. The pri-mary goal of this kind of course is to increase a student's confidence level and improve their chances of getting a better ACT composite score. Regardless of whether their goal is to just be admitted into the school or program of their choice or to be able to clinch a scholarship, every student will have their own personal goal in mind when they attend the course. Many students who take this course often sign up to take the exam in Wagner as well.

A participation fee is charged for the course and includes all of the instruction time and a textbook as well. The course has a limited number of seats available for the course and is open to any area student who is interested in this kind of preparation. March 2 is the deadline to apply for the sixsession course, which begins March 16.
