Yankton May See No April Election **As Deadline Passes To Enter Races**

As the 5 p.m. deadline for returning petitions for the Yankton City Commission and the Yankton School Board passed Friday, five people had been certified to enter the races.

However, if no other petitions are received by certified mail next week, there will not be an election in either race in April.

City Finance Officer Al Viereck said three people have returned petitions for the City Commission incumbents Dave Carda (who is also the currentmayor), Dave Knoff and newcomer

Nathan Johnson.

In the Yankton School Board race, Kathy Greeneway and Mathew Pietz were the only candidates to file at deadline.

"People who took out a petition, can choose, rather than returning the completed forms to the administration building or city hall, to have them notarized and send them via certified mail no later than 5 p.m. Friday," said YSD business manager Jason Bietz. "I don't expect to have that happen. If we don't receive additional petitions, then there will not be a school board election and (the) incumbents ... will return to the

board for another term."

Bietz noted that this could potentially be the second school board election in as many years that would not have an election.

In the city, three positions were open, but incumbent Pauline Akland chose not to seek reelection.

Viereck said while it's less likely now, there is still an outside chance a munici-

pal election will be held. "We would cancel our election and these three (would be) automatically ushered in, so to speak, Viereck said. "They would (be sworn in) at the second (City Commission) meeting in May."

He noted the last time a City Commission election was not held was in 2004. Viereck added the lack of

controversy within the city and the commission led to fewer petitions being filed.

That doesn't mean everybody's 100 percent happy all the time," he said. 'Usually, it takes controversial issues that drive somebody to say, 'I'm tired of this and I'm going to file for a petition.'

Should an additional petition for either board be received next week, the resulting general election would be held April 14.


