


HOW IS IT POSSIBLE FOR TWO PEOPLE TO BE SO CONSISTENTLY WRONG ABOUT EVERYTHING?

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Pregnant Teen Needs Support And Guidance, Not Rejection

DEAR ABBY: My best friend from school is pregnant. Her baby's father is practically nonexistent, and she has no other friends besides me and one other person. 
