Lowrie agreed that the committee meetings should have been more open. "It wasn't really promoted that it was going to be happening," he said. "I feel like it was kind of a shut-door thing."

About half of the meetings were published on the city's online meeting calendar, according to City Manager Doug Russell. He said it wasn't an attempt to keep the public away, and some members of the public attended the meetings.

Dan Ruppier, another former commissioner, agreed with Murphy that not enough information has been provided to the public. He also asked why members of earlier pool committees, or other consultants that had drawn up previous conceptual plans, were not consulted during the process.

and a multi-vehicle crash. Interstate 29 was closed between Grand Forks and the Canadian border and from Watertown to the North Dakota border.

Iowa officials closed a nearly 80-mile stretch of Interstate 35 from Ames to Clear Lake after a pileup that the state Department of Public Safety said involved as many as 40 vehicles. There was no immediate word on injuries.

In northeast Nebraska and south central and southwest Minnesota, some state highways were closed.

Some people also had to cope without heat as they waited for their power to come back on.

About 5,000 people in North Dakota, 5,400 in Iowa and about 200 in northeastern Nebraska remained without power. Outages were more severe in South Dakota, where about 7,900 people still had no electricity. More than 10,000 utility poles were believed to be down in the Dakotas and Iowa.

"Crews are getting a lot of stuff rebuilt. Then they turn around and ... other stuff is coming down," said Brenda Kleinjan, spokeswoman for the South Dakota Rural Electric Association.

some environmental issues. Hyperion filed its own court appeal, which asks that the board's decision on a carbon monoxide limit be overturned.

Circuit Judge Mark Barnett of Pierre has consolidated the two appeals to be heard as one case. After further written arguments are filed, a hearing is scheduled for June 23 in Pierre.

Ed Cable of Save Union County said Monday that opponents believe the state board has not complied with the federal Clean Air Act. Both the process and the information used by the board were flawed, he said.

Cable said the Board of Minerals and Environment also should have required a full environmental study before approving a permit for the refinery.

"If this doesn't require an environmental impact statement, what project ever would?" Cable said.

A spokesman for Hyperion did not return a phone call seeking comment Monday.

Defense Calls Its First Witness At California Prop 9 Trial

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Gay people in California enjoy substantial political power as a result of nearly unanimous support from high-ranking elected officials, labor unions, newspapers, corporations and progressive religious groups, a political scientist testified Monday in a federal trial on the state's same-sex marriage ban.

Kenneth Miller, a professor at Claremont McKenna College who teaches California politics and researches ballot initiatives, was the first defense witness in the trial over the constitutionality of Proposition 8, the voter-approved ban.

Last week, a Stanford University political scientist testified on behalf of two same-

sex couples suing to overturn the measure that gays do not have a meaningful level of political power.

Earlier Monday, a team of lawyers led by prominent litigators Theodore Olson and David Boies rested the plaintiffs' case after spending more than nine days presenting evidence on the meaning of marriage, the nature of sexual orientation, and the role of religion in shaping attitudes about both.

The last volley in their attempt to prove Proposition 8 was a product of anti-gay bias and served no legitimate public interest was videotape of a simulcast in which supporters of the ban said gay marriage would lead to polygamy and bestiality.

"It would have behooved the committee to have tapped that experience, and I'm not sure why they did not," Ruppier said.

If it is determined that more meetings are needed to gather public input than the one scheduled for Feb. 22, Mayor Dan Specht said that would be done.

Knoff stated that the reason the issue is being brought forward now is not necessarily because the committee believes the plan should be funded and built. Instead, he said the committee has completed the task it was given to draw up a plan and is seeking to take it to the next appropriate level of approval.

"I don't know that it's going to be voted on to be funded and built on the 22nd. I guess someone could make that motion to do a bond issue," Knoff said. "I have a feeling where it would go right now with the economy where it's at, so I probably wouldn't be for going forward with actually building the project. This is to get the concept going,

done and then move on." Specht added, "It's important to remember this is just a concept."

In other business Monday, the commission: • was told by Convention and Visitors Bureau Director Lisa Scheve that her organization was one of two recipients of the George S. Mickelson Great Service Award from Gov. Mike Rounds for the hospitality and customer service program the CVB developed and implemented in 2009;

• tabled a discussion of downtown parking during special events;

• approved travel expenses for several upcoming trips to promote the city;

• awarded a bid for the reconstruction of Peninah Street from Karen Drive to 21st Street. The winning bid from Feimer Construction of Yankton was \$154,200, more than \$20,000 under the engineer's estimate for the project; and

• held an executive session to discuss pending or proposed litigation.
