who lost their homes to fires.

"When we've had these fires recently, I've gotten to meet with the families to see what I can do to help them. I show them what resources are available," Smith said. "There is wonderful networking in the non-profit sector. We all work really well together. I really enjoy that. If I can't figure out something or I don't know where to send someone, I can just knock on the next door, and they can help me out."

The Red Cross office is housed at 231 Broadway along with many other United Way agencies.

Ice, Snow Chill Southern Plains Amid Power Outages

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — A powerful storm dumped snow, sleet and freezing rain on the southern Plains Thursday, disrupting power to thousands of homes and businesses, canceling flights and shutting down major highways across three states.

The National Weather Service issued winter storm warnings through Friday for much of Oklahoma and the Texas Panhandle.

Ice accumulations of more than one-half inch and high winds snapped electrical lines across Oklahoma, knocking out electrical power to tens of thousands of customers.

"In some places, as far you can see there are hundreds of utility poles on the ground," said Andrea Chancellor, spokeswoman for Public Service Company of Oklahoma.

"It could be five days for all customers who can take power to get power restored," she said.

Airlines canceled more than 100 flights at Will Rogers World Airport in Oklahoma City over concerns about icing on aircraft, spokeswoman Karen Carney said. She said additional flights will likely be canceled Friday morning.

Another 35 flights were canceled at Tulsa International Airport, said Alexis Higgins of the Tulsa Airport Authority.

by the three oil companies, to encourage them to comply with federal laws. The office would also recognize the risk involved in doing business in Iran when deciding whether to invest in companies.

Rob Wylie, director of the Retirement System, said the state might have a greater effect on investment in Iran if it encourages the oil companies to get out of Iran.

"It doesn't mean we support what goes on in these countries that are so contrary to good citizenship. They're horrid," Wylie said.

Lederman said 20 other states have passed similar laws or policies regarding investment in Iran. Lederman's bill would give the three oil companies 15 months to get out of Iran or the state would get rid of its investments in the companies.

Aside from the moral issues, the state also is taking a big risk in holding stock in the oil companies because Iran might nationalize those companies' operations in the country, Lederman said.

Fixes Being Cranked Out In Massive Toyota Recall

DETROIT (AP) — Toyota has begun shipping parts to fix the faulty gas pedals that led to a still-expanding recall and an unprecedented decision to stop selling and building some of its top-selling models, but it still could not say Thursday when millions of its drivers would get their cars fixed.

The world's largest automaker, bleeding millions of dollars a day in lost sales, also declined to say where the parts are going — to plants so production can start again or to dealers so they can start fixing cars sitting in their showrooms or already on the road.

Amid the uncertainty, the recall grew wider. Toyota expanded the recall beyond an initial 2.3 million vehicles and said it would recall an untold number in Europe and about 75,000 in China because of bad gas pedals that can become stuck.

The recall even spread

beyond Toyota. Ford Motor Co. stopped production of some full-sized commercial vehicles built by a Chinese joint venture because they have accelerators built by the same parts supplier as in the Toyota recall.

Separately, Toyota recalled 1.1 million more vehicles this week because of floor mats that can bend and hold down the gas.

The gas pedal system recall includes 2009-2010 RAV4, the 2009-2010 Corolla, the 2009-2010 Matrix, the 2005-2010 Avalon, the 2007-2010 Camry, the 2010 Highlander, the 2007-2010 Tundra and the 2008-2010 Sequoia.

But there was no estimate for how long it would be until customers can get their cars fixed. The parts are being made at CTS plants, but Toyota has not said where they're going within its system of plants and dealers.

"There's actually a guy that will stand outside on the strut (of the helicopter) — he's harnessed in — he leans out, and he's got a net gun," Schauer said. "It's a gun that will shoot a net, and when they're flying and locating the deer, he shoots the net, they land and then they harness the deer."

In less than two minutes, the crew will have an estimate on the deer's age and a blood sample, as well as place a tag on the animal's ear.
