One Dies In Union County Crash

JUNCTION CITY — One person died and another received serious injuries in a two-vehicle crash on Wednesday in Union County.

The accident occurred around 5:10 p.m. at the intersection of S.D. Highway 50 and 473rd Avenue east of Interstate 29, near Junction City, according to the South Dakota Highway Patrol.

The driver of a 1996 Chevrolet S10 was southbound on 473rd Avenue and failed to stop at the stop sign before crossing Highway 50. The Chevrolet collided with an eastbound 2005 Ford F450 truck.

The driver of the Chevrolet was thrown from the vehicle and died at the scene. The driver of the Ford suffered serious, non-life threatening injuries. Neither driver was wearing a seatbelt.

Named are being withheld until relatives have been notified. No further information is available at this time.

The South Dakota Highway Patrol is investigating. Union County Sheriff's Office, Clay County Sheriff's Office and Elk Point Fire and Emergency Medical Service assisted.

restrictions into our rural communities," Moore said. "Having a capital improvement plan (for the county road system) on the table makes me feel somewhat better now. Hopefully, in the future, we can do the work necessary (to build up those roads to handle greater loads). That being said, I will go along with rest of the commission on weight restrictions this year."

Also Wednesday, the commission:

- approved the expenditure out of contingency funds necessary for the sheriff's office to hire 11 deputies in order to have at least two people on duty in the overnight hours. Moore voted against the spending;
• approved rental rates for highway department machinery;
• designated the Press & Dakotan and the Yankton County Observer as its official newspapers;
• scheduled a 2012 planning session for 8 a.m. Jan. 24; and
• elected to give employees the afternoon of Good Friday off, as well as all of Christmas Eve in 2012. They are not considered holidays by the county, so the time off is given at the discretion of the commission.

most of the northern plains."

Masters said many storms have been affected by the high pressure that continues to be anchored over the Southwestern U.S..

"When you get a big high over the Southwest, it sets up a flow over the United States that is not typical, and it kind of steers the storms away from the Dakotas and Nebraska and Iowa, and makes things mild for a while."

Looking forward, Chapman said temperatures should begin to cool down on Friday, although temperatures will remain higher than average through the middle of next week.

"Out beyond the seven-day forecast, it looks like it will attempt to cool down closer to normal again," he said.

Firefighters Respond To House Structure Fire In Rural Yankton

Yankton firefighters responded to a structure fire east of town Wednesday afternoon.

The fire, located on Van Epp Drive along Old Highway 50 about three miles east of Yankton, was reported at about 1:10 p.m. According to fire department officials, the blaze started with a candle, which then ignited some curtains and wall covering.

The occupants of the home were awakened by the smoke detector and existed the premises without injury.

There was some minor smoke and fire damage to the structure. Because the family has a two-week-old baby, they were referred to the Red Cross for shelter for one night.

The Lori Ann Schrempf Memorial Nursing Student Scholarship was established in 2002 in memory of Lori, a nurse at Avera Sacred Heart Hospital for over 22 years. Lori's life was tragically cut short when a LifeNet helicopter en route to transport a patient crashed. Lori was the LifeNet nurse on board. The pilot and paramedic also perished in the crash. Lori had a way of teaching nurses not only the duties of the job, but the compassion and spirit of the job as well.

Applications will consist of an

application form, resume, letter of reference from a faculty member and a written narrative that focuses on: passion for nursing, community involvement and demonstrations of Avera Sacred Heart values of hospitality, compassion and stewardship.

Applications are accepted beginning Feb. 1 of each year through the Avera Sacred Heart Foundation. Deadline for all applications is April 15. The Scholarship Award is given in May of each year. This scholarship may only be given to an applicant once.

Tuesday, January 5, 1937
The past year in Yankton passed in review before local Rotarians Monday, when Dr. G. G. Bicknell, local dentist, presented his moving pictures of important occurrences in Yankton during 1936. His film featured the Diamond Jubilee, including the whisksers, sun bonnets, and parade; the American Legion convention; movies of the big snow last year and the drought this past summer.

At a brief session of the board of city commissioners last night there was some discussion of the feasibility of the city setting up a fund for the purpose of eventually carrying its own insurance on city buildings.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, January 5, 1962
Rancher Snubs Trucking and Herds His Cattle to Market Across River and Plain. Chunky Don Hight sat astride his quarter horse on a windswept hill in southern South Dakota Thursday, watching his 1,800 cattle nudge their way southwest to market over the dusty, trackless plains area. "It's better to move them all in one lick," said the red-faced, cigar-chomping rancher. "I figure I'm saving better than \$2,000 by driving them instead of using trucks."
The retail buyers tossed in \$19.9 million in pennies, the motorists shelled out \$21.6 million, the tippler plunked down \$3.2 million and the smoker \$3.4 million. Even the dead contributed more than a million. When they were lumped together the contributions accounted for most of the \$49,874,230 in total taxes collected in

South Dakota during 1961.

25 YEARS AGO

Monday, January 5, 1987
After eight years as South Dakota's governor, William Janklow is seeking a job that will meet his demand for the daily challenges and excitement that he says keeps him moving. Most state lawmakers expect Governor-elect George Mickelson to be as active as Gov. William Janklow was in handling state problems, but many expect Mickelson to be less forceful in dealing with the Legislature, according to an Associated Press survey.
