relief bill in 2007 that provided \$425 million in income, sales and property tax cuts over two years.

That's good news, but we can do better than 29th," he said. "Even with our healthy economy, many Nebraska middle-class families still struggle from paycheck to paycheck. We can help those families by changing Nebraska's income tax structure and allowing them to keep more of the money they make.'

The inheritance tax proposal triggered an immediate backlash from a group that represents Nebraska counties, many of which rely on the revenue to fill their rainy-day funds. Counties often use the money to offset property taxes or pay for weather-related emergencies, said Larry Dix, executive director of the Nebraska Association of County Officials.

"The governor left the door wide open for conversation," he said. "No line was drawn in the sand today."

Flood said he still needed to study the governor's plan in detail. "It's going to get a good discus-


50 YEARS AGO


