S.D. Lawmaker Wants Drug Tests For Welfare

RAPID CITY (AP) — A proposal to allow South Dakota officials to require welfare recipients to be tested for illegal drugs is coming back to the South Dakota Legislature.

Rapid City Republican state Rep. Mark Kirkeby says his proposal is almost identical to a bill that South Dakota lawmakers didn't approve last year.

It would apply to a number of state assistance programs for low-income South Dakotans.

The *Rapid City Journal* reports a positive drug test would throw a welfare recipient off the rolls for a year. If someone refused to take a drug test, the person could be disqualified from getting benefits for six months.

South Dakota's health and human services secretary says federal regulations don't allow someone to be barred from getting food stamps or Medicaid if they're using illegal drugs.

Omaha's Airport Ranks In Top 10 For Confiscations

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — The Transportation Security Administration has a box with hundreds of knives taken from passengers since Christmas at Omaha's Eppley Airfield.

TSA ranks the airport in the top 10 of U.S. airports for catching barred items at the checkpoints.

Besides the knives and other forbidden items, security personnel have confiscated iron skillets, power tools, a lava lamp and a six-pack of beer.

Rick Gordon is TSA's federal security director in Nebraska.

He told Omaha television station KETV that TSA agents at Eppley have confiscated more than 6,000 items in the past four years.

Nebraska Lottery Marks Powerball Anniversary

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — The Nebraska Lottery is hosting a 20th-anniversary celebration for Powerball, which includes a display case with four jackpot-winning tickets.

The *Lincoln Journal Star* says the lottery celebrated the event on Sunday, the same day the multi-state game's ticket prices and jackpots doubled.

But the star of the show was a display case with four winning tickets, including the ticket from the record \$365 million jackpot won by eight workers at a Lincoln meatpacking plant in February 2006.

The ticket is part of a larger display, which was put together by the Multi-State Lottery Association, which will travel across state borders.

Because it hosted the record winners in 2006, Lincoln was given the opportunity to showcase the display first. The event was the first of seven planned for Nebraska.

Former Employee, Nelnet Agree To Drop Suits

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — A former employee and a Lincoln-based student loan company have dropped lawsuits against each other.

Lawyers for Nelnet and Rudy Vigil filed for a dismissal that was approved last week in U.S. District Court, according to the *Lincoln Journal Star*.

The settlement didn't include any financial provisions and stipulated that Nelnet and Vigil would drop all claims against the other.

A Nelnet spokesman said the company settled because it learned Vigil had filed for bankruptcy.

"As a result, we believe it is very unlikely that we would be able to recover the costs we incurred in defending against his original meritless lawsuit," Nelnet spokesman Ben Kiser told the *Journal Star* in an email.

Vigil, who lives in Commerce City, Colo., joined Nelnet in 2003 and was fired in January 2005. He sued Nelnet, and they settled in October 2005.

Nelnet said in its lawsuit that as part of the 2005 settle-

ment, "Vigil agreed to fully and forever release and discharge Nelnet from any and all claims, demands, actions liabilities and damages of any kind and nature."

But in 2007, Vigil filed a federal lawsuit as a whistleblower under the False Claims Act. He accused the company of improperly collecting federal subsidies after violating federal lending rules.

The lawsuit was dismissed in 2010, and the dismissal was upheld on appeal.

Nelnet said that lawsuit violated the 2005 agreement. But Vigil's lawyer, Tim Matusheski, said that as long as Vigil had a reasonable belief that he was "stopping a crime or a violation of the False Claims Act, he's protected by the First Amendment and the False Claims Act."

Nelnet's lawsuit was aimed at punishing Vigil for his 2007 whistle-blower lawsuit, Matusheski said.

Nelnet's Kiser said the courts repeatedly agreed with his company's position in contesting Vigil's 2007 allegations.

S.D. Lawmaker:

Ban Permits To Carry Concealed Guns

RAPID CITY (AP) — South Dakota residents shouldn't need a permit to carry a concealed weapon, said a lawmaker who wants to repeal a state law requiring them to pay a \$10 fee and undergo a criminal background check.

Rep. Don Kopp, R-Rapid City, pointed to Wyoming, saying it has abolished its permit requirement without seeing an increase in gun violence.

South Dakota's law penalizes residents by making them "buy a permit to defend (themselves)," Kopp said.

The law allows the state to deny a concealed weapons permit for a number of reasons, including if the person is mentally

incompetent, a convicted felon or has a history of drug crimes or violence.

South Dakota Gov. Dennis Daugaard and Attorney General Marty Jackley have not taken positions on Kopp's bill, their spokespeople said. Rep. Mark Kirkeby, R-Rapid City, described himself as initially "leery" of the idea.

Rep. Lance Russell, R-Hot Springs, said he was inclined to support the proposal but might reconsider if it drew opposition from law enforcement.

"If my friends the sheriffs and others have compelling reasons, then I'm certainly going to think about that also," Russell said.

The bill has been assigned to

the House Judiciary Committee for a hearing.

It would not change other South Dakota gun restrictions. Convicted felons could still not have firearms, nor could anyone bring a concealed gun into a county courthouse. Federally required background checks would still be needed to buy a gun.

Zach Lautenschlager, a spokesman for the South Dakota Gun Owners Association, said requiring permits doesn't stop criminals from carrying firearms.

"The permit has yet to prevent a crime, but it has prevented some law-abiding people from defending themselves," he said.

might already be at a 10 percent savings," he said. "Fuel-wise, even though we're not pushing snow, we have been out grading the roads like in the summer. So we're still burning some fuel, but not near as much."

Yankton County has also had to use little funding on road work this winter, according to Highway Superintendent Alan Sorenson.

"We went out two Saturdays — one in November and one in December — and sanded, and that's all we've had to do," he said.

Although the county has saved money this winter, Sorenson said the savings thus far can be somewhat misleading.

"Everybody thinks we're going to have a bunch of money, but we started a new budget on the 1st of January," he said. "I'm on a new budget now, so who knows what could happen the rest of the year. But we finished last year's budget pretty good."

According to Al Viereck, finance officer for the City of Yankton, the city also just began a

new fiscal year, but the savings from the mild weather in November and December helped Yankton come in almost \$20,000 under budget for snow removal. Viereck said each snow removal costs the city between \$4,000 and \$12,000.

Yankton Public Services Director Kevin Kuhl said not plowing any snow this year has allowed the city to work on things besides snow removal, such as dirt work, compost handling and sign repair.

"The crews are able to accomplish other needed tasks that results in things that stick around," he said. "The sad thing about snow removal is, all your efforts melt away."

Unlike the city of Yankton, Cedar and Knox counties have a

fiscal year that runs until the end of June, so officials will have to wait and see if savings will allow them to use funds for other projects.

"Last year we put in for a new bridge, but we had to wait until April. If we would have had a bad winter then, we would've had to hold up on the bridge," Kraemer said. "This year could be the same. If we don't have to spend it on snow, we have improvements we can do."

Even though the season has been mild so far, the officials stressed that there is still plenty of time left this winter for the weather to change.

"It's been a pretty good winter so far, but spring still can't get here fast enough," Barta said with a laugh.



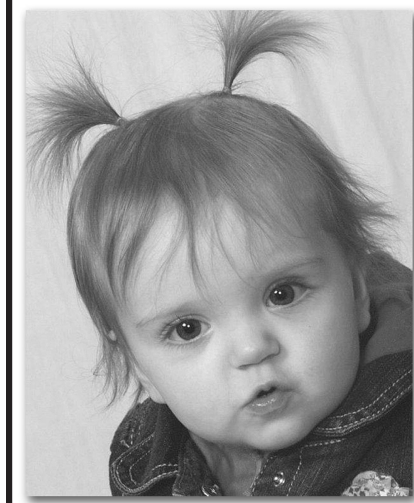
