South Dakota Rodeo Cowboy Dies In Colorado Crash

ROSEBUD (AP) — A rodeo cowboy from the South Dakota town of Rosebud died in a traffic accident in Colorado over the weekend.

Twenty-four-year-old bareback rider Austin Janis was killed early Sunday while returning to South Dakota, just hours after making his debut as a Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association cardholder at a rodeo in Texas.

The PRCA says the van that Janis and another cowboy were traveling in was struck head-on by a car on U.S. Route 385 near Wray, Colo. Janis was declared dead at the scene. The other cowboy wasn't seriously hurt.

Janis was a member of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe. His funeral is scheduled Saturday at the Lower Brule Community Center.

Oral Roberts To Retire Basketball Player's Number

TULSA, Okla. (AP) — Oral Roberts University has announced plans to retire the number 11 worn by record-setting women's basketball player Krista Ragan.

Ragan is the all-time leading scorer in the history of the Mid-Continent Conference — which is now the Summit League. She was a two-time conference player of the year, two-time conference tournament MVP and a four-time All-Conference selection.

A ceremony to officially retire her number will be Jan. 28 during the ORU women's basketball game against Missouri-Kansas City.

Officials Want Changes To Highway Where Bus Rolled

DICKINSON, N.D. (AP) — Officials are calling for changes to a southwestern North Dakota highway after a bus accident involving a high school basketball team.

The bus carrying the Hettinger-Scranton boys' team was traveling to Dickinson for a game on Friday when it went off a curve on state Highway 21 and rolled. Twenty-eight students and four staff members were on the bus. Most were treated for minor injuries but an assistant coach was hospitalized with a concussion.

NDSU Women's Soccer Coach Accepts Job At Wyoming

FARGO, N.D. (AP) — North Dakota State officials say they're looking their women's soccer coach to Wyoming.

Pete Cuadrado compiled an overall record of 93-62-8 in nine years at NDSU. He guided the program to three straight Summit League tournaments and the program's first NCAA Division I tournament berth.

Cuadrado replaces Danny Sanchez, who led the Cowgirls to their best season in history this year with a 12-6-4 record. Sanchez was named head coach at Colorado.

Bison women's athletic director Lynn Dorn says a search for a new head coach will begin immediately.

Twins Finalize Deal With Zumaya

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Relief pitcher Joel Zumaya and the Minnesota Twins have finalized their \$850,000, one-year contract.

The deal includes \$900,000 in performance bonuses for the oft-injured right-hander, who missed all of last season with an elbow injury. He broke a bone in the joint while throwing a pitch for the Tigers against the Twins in June 2010, his last appearance in a major league game.

The 27-year-old hasn't completed a full season since he was a rookie with Detroit in 2006. But he has 210 strikeouts in 209-plus career innings. If he can stay healthy this spring and still reach the upper 90s with his fastball, Zumaya would give the Twins a much-needed hard thrower in the back of their bullpen.

Rockies Sign Moyer, 49, To Minor League Deal

DENVER (AP) — Jamie Moyer has agreed to terms on a minor league contract with an invite to the Colorado Rockies' spring training, pending a physical.

The 49-year-old lefty didn't play last season after undergoing Tommy John surgery on his throwing elbow.

Moyer has played 24 major league seasons, starting with the Chicago Cubs in 1986. He went 9-9 with a 4.84 ERA for Philadelphia in 2010.

Moyer is 267-204 with a 4.24 career ERA.
