The latest ad saturating Nebraska television and radio channels is sponsored by Americans for Prosperity, a conservative group headed by billionaires Charles and David Koch, and paints Kerrey as "an East Coast liberal."

Conservatives insist the ads are necessary to inform Nebraskans of what they'd be getting with Kerrey.

"After living in New York City for more than a decade, Nebraskans hardly knew Bob Kerrey anymore, so it was important to acquaint voters with his far-left record of supporting the largest tax hike in history and championing Obamacare," American Crossroads spokesman Nate Hodson said.

The problem with the portrayal is that Kerrey's current stance on issues such as government debt and spending are anything but embraced by liberal interests.

In a recent interview with The Associated Press, Kerrey criticized President Barack Obama for not backing a set of recommendations made by an Obama-appointed committee to address the nation's rising debt crisis. The plan — commonly called the Simpson-Bowles plan for the men who chaired the committee, former Clinton chief of staff Erskine Bowles and former Republican Wyoming Sen. Alan Simpson — called for a sweeping combination of spending cuts and higher taxes to cut about \$4 trillion from the federal budget over the

coming decade.

"As unlikely as it sounds, I'd campaign on Simpson-Bowles," Kerrey said. "I think the president made a terrible mistake by not putting that in his State of the Union address and leading with it, trying to use that as a foundational way to solve this budget and debt problem."

Another example of Kerrey's independent leanings?

"I'm not sure I'd even vote to raise the debt ceiling under the current circumstances," Kerrey said. "You've got to address this debt problem."

While Nebraska Democrats aren't running ads, they're not exactly waiting quietly on the sidelines for Kerrey's decision. The state party is asking registered Democrats in the state to sign a petition asking Kerrey to run for the U.S. Senate "and give us an independent voice in the Senate instead of a lapdog for the radical right."

The conservative attack ads signal that Republicans fear a Kerrey run, Nebraska Democratic Party spokesman Brandon Lorenz said.

"They know he would immediately be a very credible and strong candidate," Lorenz said.

SD Community Action Hires Coordinator

The South Dakota Community Action Association has hired Darci Bultje of Lake Andes to serve as the South Dakota Community Action Coordinator. The Association includes the four Community Action Agencies serving the state, Inter-Lakes Community Action Partnership (ICAP) of Madison, Northeast South Dakota Community Action Program (NESDCAP), of Sisseton, Rural Office of Community Services, Inc. (ROCS) of Lake Andes and Western South Dakota Community Action Partnership (WSD-CAP) of Rapid City.

Bultje will be responsible for promoting community action within the state, securing funding for statewide projects and promoting community action activities.
