One Deer Causes Three-Vehicle Accident Monday

One unfortunate deer created three headaches for motorists on Highway 50 west of Yankton Monday night. According to a spokesman from the Yankton Fire Department, the problem started when a vehicle struck the deer just east of the intersection with Highway 52 at approximately 7:45 p.m. Monday. The accident caused a second vehicle passing by to also hit the deer. Then, while efforts were made to pull the now-dead deer off the road, a third vehicle struck the carcass. One person reported minor injuries, but no one was transported for treatment.
