CERT Program Seeks Individuals For Expansion

Yankton County Emergency Management has announced the expansion of The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program in the Yankton County area. Individuals are being sought to become CERT team members.

The first night of training will be on Wednesday, Feb. 1, running from 6:30 p.m. until approximately 9 p.m. Anyone interested in becoming a CERT member is asked to call 668-5289 or 661-4289 to sign up. There is an online pre-course that needs to be completed.

Go online to http://www.citizencorps.gov/cert/training_mta.t.shtm. This will be the training page, go to IS-317: Introduction to CERT's, and click on link here to take the course. If you do not have an Internet connection, please let us know and we will make accommodations for you.

The training will be held at the Yankton County EMS Training Facility located at 807 Capitol St. Use the west parking lot off of Douglas Ave. You are asked to use the north door at the top of the ramp located on the northeast corner of the building.

CERT educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community.

People who go through CERT training have a better understanding of the potential threats to their home, workplace and community and can take the right steps to lessen the effects of these hazards on themselves, their homes or workplace. If a disaster happens that overwhelms local response capability, CERT members can apply the training learned in the classroom and during exercises to give critical support to their family, loved ones, neighbors or associates in their immediate area until help arrives. CERT members can also assist with non-emergency projects that improve the safety of the community. CERTs have been used to distribute disaster education material, provide services at special events, such as parades, sporting events, concerts and more.

- An unattended truck rolled down an incline and struck a couple of cars pushing them into other cars, at about 8:30 p.m. Friday at the Yankton Livestock Sales company. The truck and six cars ended up in a big pile, according

to State Patrolman Dennis Westergaard, who investigated.

- The Tripp Wildcats overcame an eight point third period deficit to upset the Parkston Trojans 49 to 48 in a Little Missouri Valley Hoop contest in Tripp last night.

Tuesday, January 27, 1987

- Yankton electricity users pay less initially than customers of area rural electric cooperatives, but as usage increases, Northwestern Public Service rates outpace those of the co-ops, as well as some municipal services.

- The Yankton City Commission voted unanimously Monday to contribute \$1,000 toward efforts to renew the Essential Air Service Program. Established in 1978, the program assures that air service is provided to about 140 small communities and the country by providing subsidies to air carriers.
