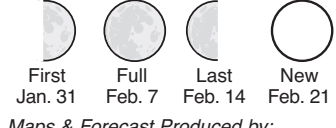

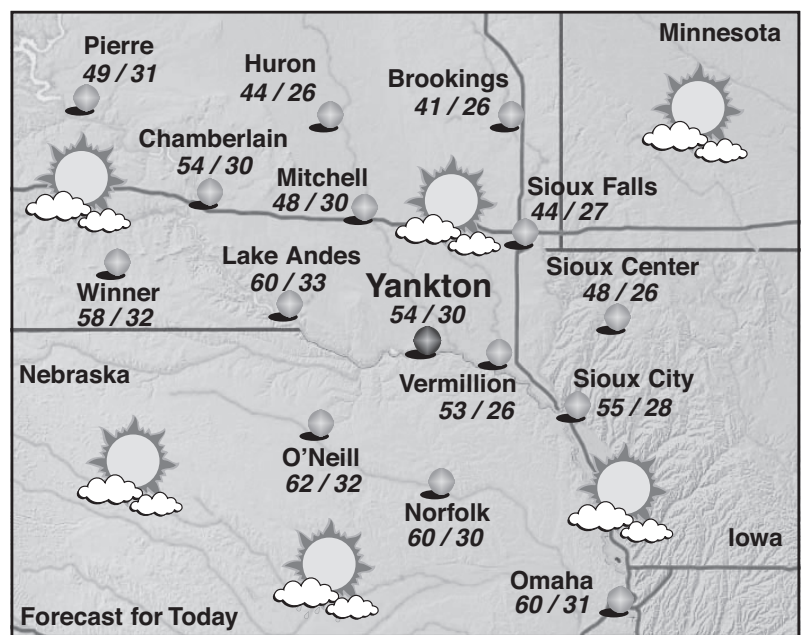

75 YEARS AGO

Saturday, January 30, 1937

A revised old age assistance program, urged by Gov. Jensen to correct what was called the "uncertain and unsatisfactory" present system, was introduced in both houses of the South Dakota legislature today by the joint state affairs committee. The group voted late yesterday to sponsor the measure, after Gov. Jensen and his advisers asserted immediate revision of the old age aid system is needed.

A statement by Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins seeking to allay fears that home work of children might be prohibited under the federal child labor amendment has been added to the controversy over ratification of the proposal by the South Dakota legislature.

50 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, January 30, 1962

mittees to write rules that would make violators subject to additional congressional penalties.

"We can start restoring some of the faith that's been lost in our government by taking this common sense step of making members of Congress play by the exact same rules as everyone else," said Sen. Kirsten Gillibrand, D-N.Y., who with Sen. Scott Brown, R-Mass., wrote the bill "We must make it unambiguous that this kind of behavior is illegal."

President Barack Obama endorsed the bill in the State of the Union speech last week, saying he would "sign it tomorrow." Brown used that opening to briefly speak with the president as he was exiting the House chamber after Tuesday's address.

"The insider trading bill's on Harry's desk right now," Brown told Obama, referring to Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid. "Tell
