VERMILLION — Vermillion Law Enforcement and Fire Department will compete to see which department can recruit the most blood donors for the community's blood supply during the seventh annual "Heroes Behind the Badges."

This fun competition between the departments will be held on Monday, Jan. 14, running from 10 a.m.-1 p.m. and 2:30-6:30 p.m. at Sanford Medical Center Vermillion.

The mobile unit will be parked at the Administration entrance on Plum Street. The public is encouraged to participate and designate their blood donation in honor of the department of their choice. The department with the most donations will receive the traveling trophy and bragging rights for the year.

"Through the years this event has helped hundreds of patients in the community during the time of year when blood supply is in urgent need," states Ken Versteeg, Executive Director, Community Blood Bank. "In the last week of 2012 and the first week of 2013 we have seen a marked increase in blood usage by 15 percent, placing a strain on the blood supply. This challenge between the departments provides the public a chance to say 'thank you' to the Law Enforcement and Fire personnel and make a significant impact in many lives in the Vermillion community."

Donors must be at least 17 years old (16 years old with a signed parent consent form), weigh 110 lbs or more and be in good general health. It is recommended that a person eat and drink plenty of fluids prior to donating blood. Please bring an ID with you at the time of donation. CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded mixed Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for March delivery fell 1 cent to \$7.4450 a bushel; March corn rose 4.50 cents to \$6.9875 a bushel; March oats rose 3 cents to \$3.3950 a bushel; while March soybeans fell 5.75 cents to \$13.7975 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures also traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

February live cattle was flat at \$1.3155 a pound; March feeder cattle fell 0.85 cent to \$1.5292 a pound; February lean hogs added 0.40 cent to \$4.60 cents a pound.

The vice president later huddled privately with the NRA and other gun owner groups for more than 90 minutes. Participants in the meeting described it as an open and frank discussion, but one that yielded little movement from either side on long-held positions.

Richard Feldman, the president of the Independent Firearm Owners Association, said all were in agreement on a need to keep guns out of the hands of criminals and people with mental health issues. But when the conversation turned to broad restrictions on high capacity magazines and as-

sault weapons, Feldman said Biden suggested the president had already made up his mind to seek a ban.

"Is there wiggle room and give?" Feldman said. "I don't know."

White House officials said the vice president didn't expect to win over the NRA and other gun groups on those key issues. But the administration was hoping to soften their opposition in order to rally support from pro-gun lawmakers on Capitol Hill.

Biden's proposals are also expected to include recommendations to address mental health care and violence on television and in movies and video games. Those issues have wide support from gun rights groups and pro-gun lawmakers.

The vice president also met Thursday with representatives
