City To Consider Recycling Options Monday

The Yankton City Commission will consider its recycling options Monday with the Vermillion/Yankton Joint Powers solid waste management system.

HDR, Inc., has completed a study of the options available, which include minor changes to the existing system, collecting additional recyclables, single-stream collection and processing, and procurement of a private operator for handling single-stream operations for the cities.

Monday's discussion will give direction to the city's representatives on the Joint Powers board.

Also, the commission will approve more than \$2 million of financial assistance from the Economic Development Administration for infrastructure improvements, as well as technical assistance from Planning and Development District III to make sure the conditions of using the federal funds are met.

The commission will also consider establishing a business improvement district that would have the ability to add a \$2 per night fee to overnight stays at certain motels.

The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

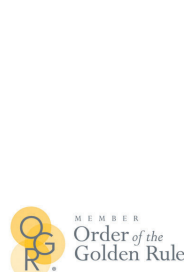

ON THIS DATE

75 YEARS AGO

Wednesday, January 12, 1938

Fifty years ago today the great blizzard of 1888 began in this section of the state. The storm started shortly after noon and before the storm was over 112 citizens of the state had lost their lives. Yesterday with the threats of storm many were wondering if the half century would bring about a similar storm.

Merchandise, estimated at around \$200, was stolen some time last night when burglars entered the Hasker Brothers store at Utica and hauled away a considerable amount of stock according to Sheriff Wm. J. Limpo who reported this morning there are no clues at the present time.

50 YEARS AGO

Saturday, January 12, 1963

Fire destroyed the Revillo school here (Revillo) last night despite the efforts of fireman from Revillo and four nearby communities who battled the blaze for several hours in below zero weather and

near-blizzard conditions.

They're state champions, and they bring in a pair of prep cagers 6-7 and 6-5, but that didn't scare the Yankton Bucks last night. Brookings was pushed to the very limit in downing the fighting Bucks, 47-43, to assure a share in the Eastern South Dakota conference front position with Mitchell.

25 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, January 12, 1888

The public hearing for an off-sale liquor license transfer application by Save-U-More Foods was continued to Feb. 8 by the Yankton City Commission. The application will be reconsidered if the store presents a plan to enclose the liquor sales area and place a 21-year-old cashier in that area for liquor sales.

Without a healthy farm and ranch economy, South Dakota's economy can never be healthy, according to U.S. Congressman Tim Johnson. Johnson spoke at a public listening meeting Monday in Yankton to address farm-related problems.
