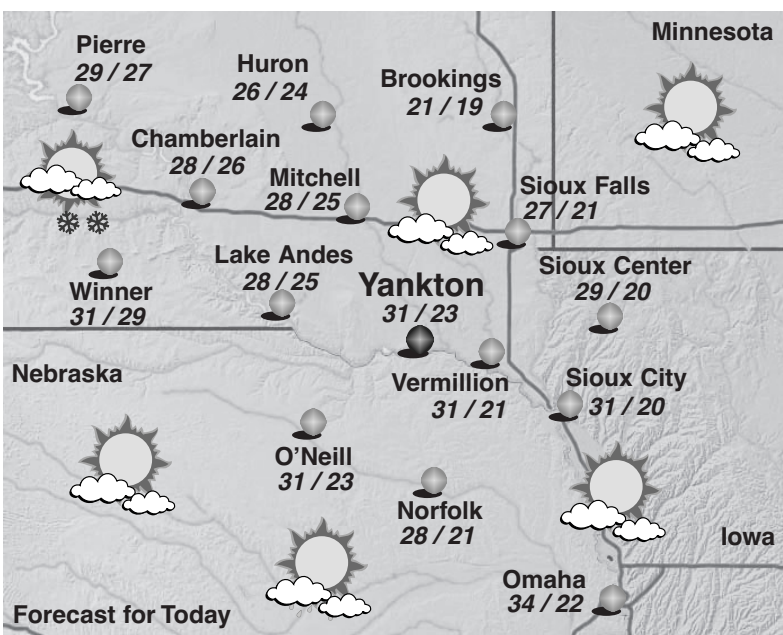

Lifeguard Training Courses Offered At SAC In Spring

The Summit Activities Center will be offering two Lifeguard Training courses this spring. The first class will be held April 12-14, and the second class will be held May 3-5. Class times for each course will be Friday from 5-10 p.m., Saturday from 8 a.m.-8 p.m., and Sunday from 8 a.m.-8 p.m. Attendance is mandatory for ALL classes AND the prerequisite testing.

Registration begins immediately. Participants may register online at www.cityofyankton.org or at the front desk of the Summit Activities Center.

Cost for the training includes lifeguard training books. Participants must be at least 15 years of age before the class ends. Prerequisites are:

- Swim 300 yards continuously.
- Starting in the water, swim 20 yards using front crawl or breast-stroke, surface dive 7-10 feet, retrieve a 10 lbs. object, return to the surface, swim 20 yards back to the starting point with the object, and exit the pool without using a ladder or steps within 1 minute and 40 seconds.
- Treading Water for 2 minutes using legs only.

Participants who fail the prerequisites will not be able to continue the course.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures jumped Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for March delivery rose 12.25 cents to \$7.67 a bushel; March corn rose 15.25 cents to \$7.24 a bushel; March oats rose 7.25 cents to \$3.54 a bushel; while March soybeans jumped 44.75 cents to \$14.18 a bushel.

Beef futures fell, while pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

February live cattle fell 0.25 cent to \$1.3035 a pound; March feeder cattle slipped 0.03 cent to \$1.5142 a pound; February lean hogs rose 1.02 cent to 85.22 cents a pound.

Saturday, January 15, 1938

- It is estimated that 750 people attended the Izaak Walton League dance held at the municipal auditorium last night, and financially the local chapter of the league materially increased its fund as a result of the event. The dance was a masquerade, the first of the kind held in Yankton this season.
- Speaking of the consolidation of truck lines, which became effective today, Vernon Van Derhule, manager of the Van Derhule Transfer and Storage Co., said that the only effect the consolidation has upon his business is that the Flammig Motor Express, Inc., one of the companies to establish the terminal here, has taken over his Class A certificates for operation on merchandise hauls between Sioux City and Yankton and that the Van Derhule company will furnish warehouse facilities for the lines operating out of here under the new setup.

25 YEARS AGO

Friday, January 15, 1988

- The U.S. Post Office will issue a stamp next year to honor South Dakota's centennial celebration, Gov. George Mickelson said Thursday. The stamp will be issued on May 4, 1989, in a ceremony to be held in Pierre, the governor said. The stamp was designed by Nancy Jane Huehl of Vivian, who won a contest sponsored by the South Dakota Centennial Commission.
- Two Yankton youths will be in Denver this weekend for the Area Playoffs of the Pepsi Hotshots, as basketball skills contest. Mike Bornitz, the son of Dean and Connie Bornitz, will compete in the boys 16-18 division and Steve Diekmann, the son of Jerry and Dianne Diekmann, will be a contestant in the boys 13-15 group. Bornitz scored 140 points in winning while Diekmann qualified with 153 points.
