Yankton's shot at upsetting fourth-ranked Sioux Falls Roosevelt was undone by the Gazelles' inability to make

It took the Gazelles 9 minutes to make its first shot from the field on Tuesday night. The Rough Riders, on the other hand, scored four seconds in after winning the opening tip and then stayed in control to cruise to an easy 59-28 victory at the Summit Activity Center.

Yankton made just 2-of-28 shots (7 percent) from the field in the first half to fall behind 13-2 at the end of the first quarter and 28-8 at halftime. The Gazelles ended up making 19 percent of their shots (11-of-58) from the field

for the game while Roosevelt hit 51 percent (25-of-49).

"A lot of times when the ball doesn't go in the hole for you, ultimately what happens is everything else becomes a struggle. That was certainly true tonight," Yankton coach Doug Pesicka said. "We had a lot of open looks early in the game. In the first three or four minutes, we got the ball inside but we just didn't get it to go down. You look at that scoreboard and you aren't scoring and the other team is and shots don't go, it just kind of snowballs on you.'

Yankton (2-7) was within 4-2 on a pair of made free throws by senior Kelsey Fitzgerald with 3:56 remaining in the first quarter. The Rough Riders, who won their fifth straight game to improve to 10-2, then scored nine straight points during the Gazelles' field goal drought.

Fitzgerald made Yankton's first field goal on a shot from the left block with 7 minutes remaining in the first half, the initial made basket after the Gazelles missed their first 16

"What happens when you don't score and the ball doesn't go in, you start to press a little bit. You start to play outside of yourself. I thought for a while we tried to play a little bit faster than we're capable of playing," Pesicka said after the Gazelles' two-game home winning streak was snapped. "... When you aren't putting the ball in the basket, everything else seems to go haywire. That's what happened to us."

Up by 20 at half, Roosevelt continued its balanced offensive attack in the final two quarters to outscore the Gazelles 31-20 after the intermission. Katelyn Johnson paced the Rough Riders with 14 points while Lauren Kunz and Haleigh Gunn each had 13. Tagyn Larson controlled the paint on both ends of the floor and finished with 11 points and 12 rebounds.
