Even supportive lawmakers say the president's gun control proposals - most of which are opposed by the powerful National Rifle Association — face long odds on Capitol

House Speaker John Boehner's office was non-committal to the president's package of proposed legislation, but signaled no urgency to act. "House committees of jurisdiction will review these recommendations," Boehner spokesman Michael Steel said. "And if the Senate passes a bill, we will also take a look

Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Patrick Leahy said ahead of Obama's presentation that he didn't know whether an assault weapons ban could pass the Senate, but said there are some measures that can, such as improved background checks.

There are some who say nothing will pass. I disagree with that," Leahy, D-Vt., told students at Georgetown University Law Center. "What I'm interested in is what we can

Acknowledging the tough fight ahead, Obama said there will be pundits, politicians and special interest groups that will seek to "gin up fear" that the White House wants to take away the right to own a gun.

"Behind the scenes, they'll do everything they can to block any commonsense reform and make sure nothing changes whatsoever," he said. "The only way we will be able to change is if their audience, their constituents, their membership says this time must be different, that this time we must do something to protect our communities and our kids.

The president was flanked by children who wrote him letters about gun violence in the weeks following the Newtown shooting. Families of those killed in the massacre, as well as survivors of the shooting, were also in the audience, along with law enforcement officers and congressional lawmakers.

This is our first task as a society, keeping our children safe," Obama said. "This is how we will be judged.'

Seeking to expand the impetus for addressing gun violence beyond the Newtown shooting, the president said more than 900 Americans have been killed by guns in the month since the elementary school massacre.

Every day we wait, the number will keep growing," he said.

The White House has signaled that Obama

could launch a campaign to boost public support for his proposals. Nearly six in 10 Americans want stricter gun laws in the aftermath of the Newtown shooting, with majorities favoring a nationwide ban on military-style, rapid-fire weapons and limits on gun violence depicted in video games, movies and TV shows, according to a new Associated Press-

A lopsided 84 percent of adults would like to see the establishment of a federal standard for background checks for people buying guns at gun shows, the poll showed.

The president based his proposals on recommendations from an administration-wide task force led by Vice President Joe Biden. His plan marks the most comprehensive effort to address gun violence since Congress passed the 1994 ban on high-grade, militarystyle assault weapons. The ban expired in 2004, and Obama wants lawmakers to renew and expand it.

Other measures Obama wants Congress to take up include limiting high-capacity ammunition magazines and requiring background checks for all gun buyers in an attempt to close the so-called "gun-show loophole" that allows people to buy guns at trade shows and over the Internet without submitting to background checks.

Obama also intends to seek confirmation for B. Todd Jones, who has served as acting director of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives since 2011.

The president's plan does little to address violent images in video games, movies and entertainment, beyond asking the CDC to study their impact on gun crimes. Some progun lawmakers who are open to addressing stricter arms legislation have insisted they would do so only in tandem with recommendations for addressing violence in entertainment.

The president's long list of executive orders also include:

- Ordering tougher penalties for people who lie on background checks and requiring federal agencies to make relevant data available to the federal background check system.

 Ending limits that make it more difficult for the government to research gun violence, such as gathering data on guns that fall into criminal hands. - Requiring federal law enforcement to

trace guns recovered in criminal investigations. - Giving schools flexibility to use federal

grant money to improve school safety, such as by hiring school resource officers. Giving communities grants to institute

programs to keep guns away from people who shouldn't have them.

Syrian Army Steps Up Offensive Against Rebels In North

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP) — Syrian troops stepped up an offensive against rebels in the north on Wednesday, following explosions targeting security forces and a university campus that killed more than 100 people in two days.

Powerful suicide car bombs that killed about two dozen people in Idlib marked another escalation in the fight for control of northern Syria, a key battlefield in the country's civil war. The day before, massive

blasts heavily damaged the main university in the commercial hub of Aleppo, killing 87 people and wounding scores of others. The nearly simultaneous bombings in

Idlib Wednesday bore the trademarks of Islamic militants, the most organized rebel fighters trying to topple President Bashar Assad's government. More than 60,000 people have been killed in the 22-month conflict, according to the United Nations.

a qualified workforce;

• attract new residents by promoting the attractive lifestyle attributes found in Yankton and its employment opportunities; and

 assist the City of Yankton in its efforts to grow the retail business community.

Rob Stephenson, the campaign operations chair, said the money raised will allow YAPG to assist with creating business opportunities as well as seizing the opportunities that come along.

What we hope to do is to continue to grow the value of the jobs we're creating," he added. "If we can create 300 jobs that have the equivalent of \$20-\$25 per hour in wages and benefits, that's our desire. We were successful in bringing people to town (with the previous campaign), but the wages and overall benefits — we can do better. That's probably the biggest challenge in creating those new jobs

The first YES! campaign had a goal of \$1.85 million and raised approximately \$2 million. Similarly, organizers hope the new fundraising effort will exceed its objective.

YES! created approximately 300 jobs and \$100 million in wages/salaries from 2008-2012, according to YAPG. It also led to \$36 million of private capital investment and \$80 million in consumer expenditures.

One of the YAPG goals in 2013 will be to build a new industrial spec building in the hopes of attracting a new manufacturing firm or helping a current Yankton business to expand.

During Wednesday's event, the beneficiaries of the last YAPG spec building, which was constructed seven years ago, shared how that assistance helped their businesses.

L&M Radiator leased the structure shortly after it was built and has since had to double its size to accommodate growing business needs. Dakota Trailer, which was already located in Yankton, has been a partner in L&M's operations and also has space in the spec building.

L&M plant manager Tony Carey said the Yankton facilitv is the "Tai Mahal" of the company's locations and has now done six straight months of \$4 million in sales.

'If you really look at it, (all this economic development) started with a spec building," said Brian Strahl of Dakota Trailer. In addition to its partnership with L&M, Dakota Trailer

received assistance from YAPG and other local entities with a new plant on the east side of Yankton. YAPG was critical to our expansion," Strahl said. "The

city and county was, too." He said shovel-ready sites are vital to encouraging industrial expansion in the county.

This time around, Strahl is serving on the capital campaign committee for YAPG's effort.

The hard sells (for YES²) are not in this room," he stated. "The committee needs your help with the people not in this room. We need you to talk to them about how important YAPG is to the future of economic development."
