Wagner Woman Reaches Plea Deal In Toddler Death

LAKE ANDES — A Wagner woman who was a caretaker when a toddler died at her home last year has pleaded guilty to drug charges and no contest to failure to report the death of a child.

Laurie Cournoyer, 29, entered her pleas Tuesday, Attorney General Marty Jackley said in a press release.

The charges stem from an incident that occurred July 4, 2012. Two-year-old RieLee Lovell was found dead in a closet of the home of Cournoyer and her 21-year-old husband, Taylor Cournoyer, in a housing development outside Wagner.

Taylor Cournoyer pleaded guilty to drug charges and was sentenced last fall to 13 years in prison on methamphetamine (meth) charges related to the case.

The youngster was believed to be dead for at least one day while under the Cournoyers' care. Court documents say the couple had been using meth and marijuana in the time leading up to RieLee's death.

Following RieLee's death at the Cournoyers' house, five other children in the couple's care were taken to the Wagner Police Department.

According to Jackley, this marks the first conviction under South Dakota's version of Caylee's law, which became law July 1, 2012. The South Dakota law says a parent, guardian or caretaker could face felony charges for knowingly failing to report a child's death within six hours.

The South Dakota law was modeled after Florida legislation passed following the death of Caylee An-

thony, which garnered national attention.

During Tuesday's court action, Laurie Cournoyer entered pleas on the following charges:

- one count of possession of a controlled substance (meth), a Class 4 felony, punishable by up to 10 years imprisonment and/or a \$20,000 fine;
- one count of keeping a place for use or sale of controlled substances, a Class 5 felony, punishable by up to 5 years imprisonment and/or \$10,000 fine;
- one count failure to report death of a child, a Class 5 felony, punishable by up to 10 years imprisonment and/or a \$10,000 fine.

Cournoyer pleaded no contest to the last count dealing with reporting a child's death, but she still has been convicted of that crime, according to the attorney general's office.

In addition, Cournoyer pleaded guilty to another drug charge, Jackley said in the press release. She pleaded guilty to one count of possession of a controlled substance (meth), a Class 4 felony, punishable by up to 10 years imprisonment and/or a \$20,000 fine.

This charge stemmed from the possession of meth while incarcerated at the Charles Mix County Jail in Lake Andes.

Cournoyer faces up to a total of 30 years in prison and \$60,000 in fines on the charges, the attorney general said.

Sentencing is scheduled for 10 a.m. March 14 in Charles Mix County.
