As I was taking a Nebraska high school basketball game report Friday night, I learned something: the Nebraska School Activities Association instituted a mercy rule for basketball, beginning in the 2013-14 season.

Here's the short version: if a game gets to a 40-point margin at or after halftime, a running clock is used in the second half. Even if the margin falls below 40 points, the running clock goes through the end of the game.

As a reporter who has covered some one-sided games, and a former high school basketball player who was on the wrong end of a few of those scores, I am completely in favor of such a rule.

While those one-sided games do give an opportunity to empty the bench, they can also provide for some bad blood. I know I ditched out more than one hard foul when playing against a team I thought was running up the score, and I'm sure I'm not the only player who has done so.

Basketball Mercy Rule Not A Bad Idea

It's also hard on the team that's ahead by that many. You empty your bench, but how do you ask kids who seldom get on the floor to "take it easy" on the other team? The coach whose game I took Friday night — Crofton's Aaron Losing — said his team might have had a hard time keeping the score under 100 points had the running clock not been in effect. It wasn't because they were trying to run up the score, but even the end of their bench was that much ahead of anyone the other team could put on the floor.

High school — and lower level — athletics are meant to be a learning experience, and winning and losing are a part of the learning curve. But there comes a point where there are no more lessons to be learned when a team is that far ahead or behind. And, when a team is in your conference or your district, you can't help but schedule them, no matter how much of a mismatch it would be.

I had a coach in high school who thought that scores shouldn't even be kept in sub-varsity games. I wouldn't go that far, as I do believe that learning to win with grace and lose with dignity are a part of the game. But when teams are so mismatched, there comes a point where it is impossible to keep grace and dignity as a part of the game. That's where a mercy rule can help.

Vikings Retain Counsel To Look Into Kluge Charges

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — The Minnesota Vikings have retained a former chief justice of the Minnesota Supreme Court and a former federal trial attorney to conduct an investigation into Chris Kluge's allegations that he was released from the team due to his support of gay marriage.

Former Chief Justice of the Minnesota Supreme Court Eric Magnuson and former Justice Department attorney Chris Madel will lead the investigation.

"It is extremely important for the Vikings organization to

react immediately and comprehensively with an independent review of these allegations," team President Mark Wilf said in a statement Friday, one day after Kluge penned an article alleging that special teams coordinator Mike Priefer made anti-gay comments during team meetings.

Priefer denied Kluge's allegations, and the Vikings said they take the matter "very seriously."

Magnuson and Madel now work at Robins, Kaplan, Ciresi and Miller. The Vikings said the investigation is already under-

way and interviews are being conducted with current and former members of the organization.

Kluge said that he is pleased to see the team is taking the matter seriously and he looked forward to cooperating with the investigation. Several players have come out in support of Priefer, but Kluge did say that he has witnesses who will corroborate his claims. He reiterated his hope that bringing this issue to light would discourage the Vikings or other teams from employing Priefer.
