Nickles said the fire in the 400 block of West 15th Street was extinguished prior to the department's arrival and an investigation revealed the spoon beneath a small slot in the oven.
"Clear down at the bottom, I found the spoon minus the plastic handle," Nickles said. "It looked like she had a fire but it put itself out. It put some light smoke in the trailer. There was no damage."

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for March delivery was 3.25 cents lower at \$6.0250 a bushel; March corn was 1.75 cents lower 4.26 a bushel; March oats advanced 12.75 cents to \$3.6350 a bushel; while March soybeans declined .75 cent to \$12.76 a bushel.

February live cattle fell .30 cent to \$1.3652 a pound; March feeder cattle was .28 cent lower \$1.6782 a pound; while February lean hogs fell 1.10 cents to \$8.552 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

The Dow Jones industrial average got a lift from health care stocks on Tuesday. UnitedHealth Group, the nation's biggest health insurer, and Johnson & Johnson both rose after analyst's raised their recommendations on the stocks. The Standard & Poor's rose for the first time this year after slumping for three straight days, its worst start to a year since 2005.
The Dow Jones industrial average rose 105.84 points, or 0.6 percent, to 16,530.94.
The Standard & Poor's 500 index gained 11.11 points, or 0.6 percent, to 1,837.88.
The Nasdaq composite rose 39.50 points, or 1 percent, to 4,153.18.

The S&P 500 is up 6.51 points, or 0.4 percent.
The Nasdaq is up 21.28 points, or 0.5 percent.

Nine Mount Marty College students plus three faculty/staff departed on Jan. 3 for a service trip. The group worked with Habitat for Humanity in Oklahoma City, Okla., on Saturday, Jan. 4, and then traveled to West, Texas, on Jan. 6 to help clean up after the fertilizer plant explosion that occurred in April 2012. On Jan. 8-10, the group will wrap up their service by helping Habitat for Humanity in Waco, Texas.
Each day begins with prayer together, breakfast and work and ends with group reflection and sharing about what was encountered that day followed by group prayer. Different faiths are represented by the participants. Trip organizer and campus chaplain, Fr. Thomas Wordekemper, says it's more than just doing work. "Part of the enrichment is seeing a different part of the country, experiencing different socio-economic conditions and working side by side with those who are less fortunate than we are. Each person keeps a personal log of their experiences and reflections of their time on the trip. It really is a memorable, and sometimes life changing experience."
