

Not more than four of the commissioners may be members of the same political party;

At the time of their appointment, at least four shall be farmers actually residing on a farm, engaged in agriculture, deriving at least twothirds of their gross annual incomes from crop or livestock production or both, and interested in wildlife conservation; and

At the time of their appointment three commissioners shall reside west of the Missouri River and five shall reside east of the Missouri River.

Both Cerny and Knippling met the agriculture requirements.

We're looking at maybe a coffee shop and maybe even a drive-through. We're looking at all the options."

'So far in 2013, GSA has sold or transferred 44 facilities across the country, generating \$40 million in sales," she said. "And we have an additional 100 properties that are moving into the disposal pipeline. Since 2010, GSA has completed nearly 400 disposal transactions, which have generated \$145 million in proceeds and eliminated more than 12,500 acres of excess land.

"There is still more that needs to be done," she added. "GSA is actively working with all federal landholding agencies to identify unneeded assets and move them into the disposal process.'

The downtown Yankton post office was closed in January 2012 and put up for sale. Postal operations were consolidated into the annex at 506 West 25th Street. That facility was built in 2000.

NY Judge OKs JPMorgan \$1.7B Deal NEW YORK (AP) – A judge in Manhattan by federal authori-

on Wednesday approved a nonprosecution agreement reached after JPMorgan Chase & Co. agreed to pay \$1.7 billion to settle criminal charges stemming from its failure to report its concerns about Wall Street swindler Bernard Madoff's private investment service.

U.S. District Judge Kevin Castel said there was nothing about the deal between the nation's largest bank and the government that would "require judicial intervention to protect the integrity of the process." He said it seemed the agreement was "knowing and voluntary" and in the best interests of the public.

The judge's approval came a day after the deal was announced

After his retirement from the Rounds cabinet, Rounds appointed him to his first term on the commission in 2010. That term ends Friday. So far Daugaard has appointed three members dur-

ties. The agreement requires the bank to pay the \$1.7 billion forfeiture — the largest by a U.S. bank for a Bank Secrecy Act violation and to acknowledge failures in its protections against money laundering and reform them.

JPMorgan will pay more than \$2.5 billion in total to settle claims stemming from Madoff's fraud, which was revealed in December 2008, when he ran out of money to honor requests for withdrawals by thousands of investors. Less than \$300 million of their original investment of nearly \$20 billion remained, although Madoff had sent statements only days earlier claiming it had grown to more than \$60 billion.
