the debate. I also think there will be a lot of discussion on the proposals from the Water Funding Tax Force."

Despite such focus, Larson doesn't necessarily see the unicameral passing legis-

lation on those topics. "Overall, I don't expect many major changes to be passed with regards to either subject, but I know we will see a lot of debate on both

on the floor," he said. Larson plans to introduce several bills this year, including a bill to improve access to hunting programs for indi-

viduals with special needs. The state senator also plans to address the issue of

certain permits. 'My office received several calls this summer with questions and frustrations over permits to harvest hay and mow land bordering state highways, so I will in-

troduce legislation to allow

that to be done every year instead of every other year," he said.

Larson also plans to introduce a bill to create a website in the Department of Revenue to list the tax delinquent properties across the state.

"A list of these properties is already published in each individual county, but this website would allow individuals to access information from each county about its tax delinquent properties from one place," he said. In addition to these new

bills, Larson also will carry over a few pieces of legislation from the previous session.
