Yes, it has only been five games. But when was the last time there was this much excitement for the Yankton Bucks boys' basketball

At 3-2, the Bucks are already well on their way to breaking last season's 6-win campaign — heck, they'll likely win as many games as the last two seasons combined (10).

Watching Yankton demolish Brookings by 26 in Tuesday night's victory at the Summit Center, and watching the crowd react to explosive play after explosive play, you couldn't help but wonder, 'Just how Well, let's take a look:

 Yankton has not one, not two, but three legitimate scoring threats. The return of senior J.J. Hejna (17 ppg) along with junior Brady Hale (17.6) and sophomore Reid Sawatzke (13.4) will make the Bucks a tremendously tough 'out' for the post-season.

 More than just those three standouts, Yankton surrounds its top-flight talent with capable role players. Senior Chipper Granflaten had 12 points and six rebounds Tuesday, while senior Ryan Olson added 11 points and five rebounds. You don't absolutely need that kind of offensive production from those two, but if you can get, you'll obviously take it.

• To me, the defensive end is where you can really see head coach Chris Haynes' impact on this program right now. Yankton forced 26 turnovers Tuesday, thanks to its relentless pressure — Brookings' standout Tyler Nagy had eight, himself. The key, though, is not being reckless with that defense, and the Bucks weren't in their win. Yankton's went nearly a full first half without committing a team foul, and only had seven in the game.

There are going to be 'off' nights during the rest of the season, we all know that. But the key for this Bucks team is not compiling one bad night with another, and then another, which was what seemed to

I still believe this is a state tournament-bound team (I actually used the term "darkhorse"), and after

Tuesday's performance, it's easy to see why one would say that about the Bucks.

Time will tell, though, how that plays out. All I know right now is that it's a fun team to watch. And that in itself is an improvement from previous seasons.

Stevens' Gorman Earns Gatorade Honor

CHICAGO — In its 29th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes. The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, announced Tamara Gorman of Stevens High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade South Dakota Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Gorman is the first Gatorade South Dakota Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from Stevens High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse. distinguishes Gorman as South Dakota's best high school girls cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Gorman joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-00, 2000-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, III.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.) and Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Vieio HS, Calif.)

The 5-foot-8 senior captured first place at the 2013 ITU Junior Triathlon World Championship in London, logging a time of 57:08 and becoming the first ever U.S. female to earn a gold medal at the competition. The state's two-time returning Gatorade Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Gorman was the fastest South Dakota runner at the 2013 Nike Cross Nationals Heartland Regional championships, earning ninth place in 18:05.7. She was also the runner-up at the Class AA state meet, crossing the line in 14:24.81.

Gorman has maintained a 3.25 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics, as a Rapid City Racers swim team coach and as an elementary school

Gorman remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

Three-time winner Gorman joins Gatorade South Dakota Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Alex Hess (2011-12, Roosevelt High School), Madeleine Takahashi (2009-10, Sturgis Brown) Seanna Kautz (2008-09, Roosevelt), and Mariah Hofer (2007-08, Yankton) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in

SDSU Stadium Meetings Set

BROOKINGS — South Dakota State University Director of Athletics Justin Sell will host a pair of town hall meetings next week to provide updates on a proposed on-campus football stadium.

The first town hall meeting is scheduled for noon on Monday, Jan. 13, on campus at the Volstorff Ballroom in the University Student Union, A second town hall meeting is scheduled for 5 p.m. on Wednesday, Jan. 15, at the McCrory Gardens Education and Visitor Center in Brookings.

Both meetings are open to the campus community and general public.

The proposed stadium, which would be constructed on the current Coughlin-Alumni Stadium site, would seat between 18,500 and 20,000 spectators and cost an estimated \$60-65 million. Plans call for the stadium to be funded through private gifts and long-term revenue streams, including concessions and suite, loge box and ticket sales. The intention is to secure bonds to finance up to two-thirds of the project's construction, with the remaining third coming from private support. Lead gifts totaling \$12.5 million from Sioux Falls banker Dana Dykhouse and philanthropist T. Denny San-

ford were announced in October. A facility program plan was endorsed by the South Dakota Board of Regents in late November, and will be up for approval in the South Dakota Legislature during the upcoming session. If approved, construction on the east and south sides of the stadium would take place in 2015, with completion of the project scheduled for the summer of

During the strike-shortened 1994 season, Maddux went 16-6 with a career-best 1.56 ERA, which is even more impressive compared to the cumulative NL ERA of 4.21 (the 2.65 differential was the highest ever recorded). The following year he went 19-2 with a 1.63 ERA for the World Series champions, even while hitters continued to put up
