Woman Killed In Crash

PARKSTON — A Tripp woman died in a one-vehicle crash on S.D. Highway 37 about seven miles north of Parkston Friday.  
According to a press release from the South Dakota Highway Patrol, Barbara Armstrong, 85, was northbound driving a 2004 Jeep Cherokee. She lost control of the vehicle on the icy road. The vehicle entered the east

ditch and rolled, coming to rest on the driver's side. Armstrong was not wearing a seatbelt. She was thrown from the vehicle and died at the scene.  
No further information is immediately available.  
The highway patrol is investigating. The Hutchinson County Sheriff's Office and Parkston Fire Department assisted.

City To Consider Meridian Plaza Plan

The Yankton City Commission will discuss Monday how to proceed with proposed improvements to the Meridian Bridge Plaza.  
Phase one of the master plan would focus on the area north of the upper level entrance of the bridge that is adjacent to Second Street. The proposal includes trellises on the west edge to provide a visual block of the gas station and private housing properties. Spray jets would shoot small water streams up from the concrete, which planners believe would be an attraction for families in the warm-weather months. The focal point and large feature of the plaza would be a fountain of flowing water and walls around the fountain to provide seating for people to stop, relax, rest and reflect. The area would also incorporate turf, flowers, native

plantings and trees.  
The cost of the first phase is estimated at \$685,000.  
The city currently has approximately \$900,000 in its downtown improvements capital budget, which could be used for the plaza.  
The two additional phases of the project, which would focus on other areas, would cost \$203,000 and \$340,000, respectively.  
In other business Monday, the commission will hold an executive session to review the annual performance of the city manager and the city finance officer, discuss the city attorney hiring process and consider a fee structure for digital aerial imagery of the community for which the city has paid.  
The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stock indexes mostly rose Friday as investors shrugged off a report of a sharp slowdown in hiring last month.  
There were a number of signs that investors were being cautious after the data, however. Prices rose for bonds and gold, traditional "go-to" assets for nervous investors. Utilities and other kinds of low-risk, high-dividend stocks also rose as investors sought safe places to park money.
