 Still, despite that record, Denver is still a "force to be reckoned with in our league," USD head coach Amy Williams said.  
 "They've had some good games that were really close that they couldn't get over the hump," she said. "Their record is not indicative of their type of team. We'll have our hands full."  
 Especially in a new environment against a new opponent.  
 "It'll be interesting to see," Williams said. "They're a virtual unknown at this point."  
 The Coyotes will also not be able to get to Denver's arena until Sunday, the day of the game, because of a

hockey game on Saturday.  
 USD, though, has other issues to concern itself with this week. Leading scorer Nicole Seekamp remains sidelined with an ankle injury and will miss Sunday's game, Williams said. Seekamp, a junior, injured the ankle before the season and had been playing through pain.  
 Although the Coyotes will again be short-handed this weekend, the team has tried to refocus on the defensive

end, Williams said — she had said earlier that her team was still giving up too many points.  
 "We've identified that we have to become a better defensive team if we plan to have success the rest of the way," Williams said. "We recognize that and can see that."
