Wagner Man Arrested For Assault

WAGNER — A Wagner man has been arrested for the alleged aggravated assault of his girlfriend, according to Charles Mix County Sheriff Randy Thaler.

Joseph Hartley, 18, was arrested following an incident that occurred at approximately 2 a.m. Saturday morning, Thaler said in a news release.

The Charles Mix County sheriff's office received a call of a disturbance at the residence located at 306 First Street SE in Wagner.

Upon investigation of the disturbance, an unconscious female was discovered in the residence. The 19-year-old female showed signs of strangulation, human bite marks and bruising. She was taken by ambulance to Wagner Community Memorial Hospital-Avera (WCMH-A) and was later air evacuated to a Sioux Falls hospital.

Hartley, boyfriend of the victim, was interviewed and subsequently arrested for aggravated assault of the female victim.

The investigation continues by the Charles Mix County sheriff's office with the assistance of the South Dakota Division of

Criminal Investigation (DCI), according to Thaler's release. The name of the victim is currently being withheld for privacy reasons, the sheriff added.


