

USD's Hertting, Krysl Earn Summit League Honors

VERMILLION — South Dakota junior swimmer Colin Krysl has been named Summit League Men's Swimmer of the Week and freshman diver Greysen Hertting has been named Summit League Women's Diver of the Week as announced by the league office Tuesday.

It is the first weekly honor for Krysl, who hails from Bellevue, Neb. Krysl won three individual events in a dual against South Dakota State Saturday in Brookings. Krysl swept the butterfly events, touching the wall in 51.78s in the 100 and 1:54.55 in the 200. He also won the 200 individual medley with a time of 1:59.36.

Hertting has been named Swimmer of the Week seven of 10 times this season. This week she won the one-meter dive in the dual with South Dakota State with a score of 277.65 points which were 45 points clear the rest of the field. The Appleton, Wis., native took second in the three-meter dive with 232.13 points. Hertting holds the top Summit League marks in both events this season.

The Coyotes' men's and women's squads next compete Friday at Morningstar College in Sioux City, Iowa. South Dakota State's Clark Kocourek earned men's diving honors. IUPUI's Margaret Barber earned women's swimming honors.
